RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

The General Plan for Prince George's County

For the purpose of approving with amendments, as an Act of the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council, the General Plan for Prince George's County, thereby defining long-range policies for development pattern, environmental protection, transportation, public facilities, economic development, housing, revitalization, urban design and historic preservation for Prince George's County.

WHEREAS, The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission, with the concurrence of the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council, in Council Resolution CR-49-2000, initiated preparation of a General Plan for Prince George's County, in accordance with Part 13, Division 2 of the Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the procedures for preparation of a plan, the Prince George's County Planning Board of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission published an information brochure and held a public forum on May 1, 2001, to inform the public of the intent and procedures for preparing the General Plan; established goals, concepts, guidelines and a public participation program; convened forums, town meetings, and focus groups to formulate and review plan proposals; and

WHEREAS, the District Council and the Planning Board of the Commission held a duly advertised joint public hearing on the Preliminary General Plan for Prince George's County on March 26, 2002, and, subsequently, the Planning Board adopted the General Plan with amendments, as described in Prince George's County Planning Board Resolution
