LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Fiscal Policy and Government Operations Date: October 30, 1991
Committee Report

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0 (In favor: Council Members Wineland, Del Giudice, Fletcher, MacKinnon and Mills)

This legislation would permit Correctional Officers to negotiate through the collective bargaining process a pension system that would provide coverage in lieu of coverage in the Maryland State employees' retirement and employees' pension system.

As a result of this legislation, the Correctional Officer will be on equal footings with their fellow public safety employees by authorizing the establishment of a pension plan.

This legislation does not establish a pension plan, nor does it affect

the Supplemental Pension Plan that now exists for Correctional Officers. Any plan established pursuant to this bill must be negotiated through the collective bargaining process and approved by the Council.

The Legislative Officer and the Office of Law have reviewed the legislation and find it to be in proper legislative form.

There should not be any negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CB-107-1991.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

This legislation would provide statutory authority for the County to establish a pension plan for public safety employees in the Department of Corrections in lieu of their participation in the Maryland State Retirement and Pension Plans. This legislation does not establish a pension plan, or require that a pension plan be established, and it does not affect the Supplemental Pension Plan covering Correctional Officers.

There is no fiscal impact associated with this legislation.
