SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,			
Maryland, that Sections 26-135 and 26-135.01 of the Prince George's County Code be and the			
same are hereby added:

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to encumber, obstruct or in any manner			
interfere with the free and uninterrupted use of any County road, street, highway, or public rig	<u>zht</u>

of way by leaving cones and objects thereon.

Sec. 26-135.01. Removal of cones and objects by County agencies; exceptions.

- (a) The Revenue Authority, Department of Public Works and Transportation, the Department of Permitting, Inspections and Enforcement and the County Police Department are authorized to remove cones and objects on any County road, street, highway, or public right of way.
- (b) The removal of cones and objects set forth in Sec. 26-135.01(a) shall not apply to an official use by a governmental entity, or use by a public utility.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
