The Public Facilities Element of the Preliminary Eastover / Forest Heights / Glassmanor Sector			
	Plan and Proposed Sectional Map Amendment		
For the purpose of identifying inconsistencies between the public facilities proposed in the			
Preliminary Eastover / Forest Heights / Glassmanor Sector Plan and Proposed Sectional Map			
Amendment and existing or proposed State or County facilities, and approving the inclusion of			
any highway or transportation line proposals prior to the adoption of the sector plan by the Prince			
George's County Planning Board of The Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning			
Commission.			
WHEREAS, Section 27-645(b)(1) of the Zoning Ordinance for Prince George's County,			
Maryland, being also Subtitle 27 of the Prince George's County Code, requires the Prince			
George's County Planning Board to submit its proposal for public facilities in the preliminary			
sector plan to the County Executive and the District Council for identification of any			
inconsistencies between the public facilities recommendations and existing or proposed State or			
County public facilities, including roads; and, in the event of any inconsistencies, the District			
Council shall direct the Planning Board on how the inconsistencies shall be eliminated or			
accommodated within the plan; and			
WHEREAS, Section 27-645 also requires the Planning Board to submit its proposals for			
public facilities in the preliminary plan to the District Council and the County Executive prior to			

its adoption of the Plan; and

WHEREAS, Section 27-645 further provides that the adopted plan may not include a highway or transportation line unless the District Council approves by resolution, after consultation with the County Executive, the inclusion of the highway or transportation line for planning purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Ordinance also provides a 60-day review period for the County Executive and the District Council to consider the preliminary recommendations, provide written comments, and identify any inconsistencies between the public facilities proposed in the plan and any existing or proposed State or County facilities including roads, highways, or other public facilities; and

WHEREAS, in adopting CR-28-12 on May 15, 2012, the District Council authorized initiation of a Sector Plan for the Eastover / Forest Heights / Glassmanor and concurrent Sectional Map Amendment and approved the Goals, Concepts, Guidelines and a Public Participation Program in order to develop a comprehensive approach to implement the recommendations of the 2002 General Plan, to ensure that future development is consistent with County policies; and

WHEREAS, the sector plan area generally includes the land area of Prince George's County bounded to the south by the Capital Beltway, to the west at the District of Columbia Line / Southern Avenue, and includes properties along Livingston Road to the Northeast, in Planning Area 76A; and

WHEREAS, on July 23, 2013, the Planning Board referred the public facilities recommendations in the Preliminary Sector Plan and Proposed Sectional Map Amendment for review, comments, and the identification of any inconsistencies between the public facilities proposed in the Plan and any existing or proposed State or County facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Office of the County Executive, by letter dated September 10, 2013, to the Chairman of the Planning Board expressed general support for the public facilities recommendations contained within the preliminary plan; and

WHEREAS, as noted in comments supplied by the County Executive, stormwater management and environmental projects will require evaluation and analysis for engineering and construction feasibility, cost to benefit ratios, (impervious area treated/pollution removal credits), and availability of funding capacity and that the County must respond to the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System/ Municipal Separate Stormwater Sewer Systems ("NPDES/MS4")

permit issued by the Maryland Department of the Environment ("MDE") which requires treatment of 8,000 acres of impervious area, and the Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") mandated Watershed Implementation Plan ("WIP II") which requires the County to implement watershed restoration programs through reduction of nutrient loads and Total Maximum Daily Loads ("TMDL's"), noting that both of these programs will generate projects relative to the scope of the Eastover public facilities plan; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Environmental Resources will take the following steps in order to consider and advance these plans: (1) Perform desktop feasibility analyses on project objectives and resultant benefits with pollution control, water quality, impervious area treatment, and credit efficiencies; (2) Evaluate opportunities for CIP funding, budget inclusion; (3) [Examine] project capacity in consideration of current project loads; and (4) [Assess] Potential for Public-Private Partnership ("P3") participation within scope of Contract; and

WHEREAS, additional measures to be considered include conducting outreach and education with commercial property and business owners on the County's Stormwater Rebate Program to incentivize retrofitting impervious areas with on-site water quality, stormwater management practices, such as pervious pavement of parking lots, pavement removal, rain gardens; and

WHEREAS, implementation of these management practices benefits the public health, safety, and welfare, and may lead to reductions in Clean Water Act fees, and

WHEREAS, any recommendations to reconstruct MD Route 210 must be addressed by Maryland State Highway Administration ("MDSHA") and possibly the Town of Forest Heights, and

WHEREAS, the service roads are County-maintained roadways outside of the corporate boundaries of the Town of Forest Heights and reconstruction and/or replacement will require the formation of a joint CIP project and, upon completion of the newly created public space, DPW&T's Office of Transportation is prepared to make improvements to bus shelters and other passenger amenities; and

WHEREAS, in furtherance of the plans, the identification of jurisdictional responsibilities concerning the affected property owners to road rights-of-way (ROW), as well as public realm and placemaking improvements is needed; and

WHEREAS, recommendations impacting the Glassmanor Transforming Neighborhoods Initiative ("TNI") are designated as the County Executive's highest priority in the plan area, and

WHEREAS, any recommendations to reconstruct MD Route 210 must be addressed by Maryland State Highway Administration ("MDSHA") and possibly the Town of Forest Heights, and

WHEREAS, the District Council has reviewed the proposed public facilities report for the Preliminary Eastover / Forest Heights / Glassmanor Sector Plan, set forth in Attachment A and incorporated as if set forth fully herein, along with the comments supplied by the County Executive by letter dated September 10, 2013, and concluded that the proposed public facilities recommendations in the preliminary plan are consistent with the County's Capital Improvement Program ("CIP") and the State's Consolidated Transportation Program ("CTP").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that the public facilities recommendations in the Preliminary Eastover / Forest Heights / Glassmanor Sector Plan and Proposed Sectional Map Amendment as transmitted by the Planning Board on July 23, 2013, and set forth in Attachment A and incorporated as if set forth fully herein, be and the same are hereby approved for inclusion in the preliminary plan.
