CB-17-2011 (DR-2) - AN ACT CONCERNING ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT **AND LOCAL EMPLOYMENT** for the purpose of enhancing the County's economic development by creating bidding preferences and participation requirements for County-based businesses on certain procurement contracts for goods and services with the County and aggregate procurement requirements for goods and services in County assisted developments; establishing a First Source Hiring Program that requires a certain percentage of local hiring for positions on certain procurement projects directly funded by the County and procurement contracts in County assisted developments, requiring a certain percentage of local hiring for new hires in County assisted businesses, requiring submission of quarterly audit reports, maintaining a first source registry, providing for penalties and exemptions to the program; requiring the use of Community Benefit Agreements on County assisted developments that have a value equal to or greater than \$1,000,000; requiring Labor Peace Agreements for County assisted developments receiving \$500,000 or more in county assistance; requiring each County agency, department, or office to meet an annual local hiring goal for new hires in classified service positions; converting all Minority Business Enterprise goals to County-based Minority Business Enterprise goals for minority contracting and purchasing and generally relating to economic development in the County.- DR-2 SUBSTITUTED; PRESENTED
