BILL

AN ACT concerning

Flag Protocol

FOR the purpose of providing for the establishment of criteria for the lowering of flags at County facilities upon the death of governmental officials or employees killed in the line of duty. BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

> SUBTITLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS. Section 1-106.1,

The Prince George's County Code

(1987 Edition and 1988 Supplement).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 1-106.1 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with amendments to read as follows:

SUBTITLE 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Sec. 1-106.1. Lowering of flag.

The County Executive shall [order all County agencies to lower the American, Maryland and Prince George's County flags displayed on agency flag poles when any governmental employee is killed in the line of duty while protecting the citizens and the community of Prince George's County. Said flags shall be lowered from the notice of death until the day after the funeral.] <u>establish criteria for</u> <u>the lowering of flags at County facilities upon the death of</u> <u>governmental officials and County employees killed in the line of</u> <u>duty.</u>

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after the date it becomes law. Adopted this 17th day of April, 1990.
