PUBLIC SAFETY & FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 6/19/00

Committee Vote: Favorable as amended, 3-0, (In favor: Council Members Wilson, Maloney and Scott).

This bill will amend certain definitions and provisions of the code regulating taxicabs and limousines; change various fees and fines; mandate insurance coverage in an amount required by State law; amend the requirements for certificates of registration; increase the rates; and otherwise generally relate to the regulations of taxicabs and limousines in the County.

The Office of Business and Regulatory Affairs, Council Member Maloney, John Lally

representing Silver Cab and members of the industry, recommended proposed amendments to the legislation. After a lengthy discussion of the legislation with representatives of the taxicab industry, the committee approved the proposed amendments.

Stanley Bretner, representing Bluebird Checker Yellow Transportation Services, expressed his displeasure with the legislation and requested that it be held in Committee.

There will be a positive fiscal impact on the County related to increased fee and fine amounts from licenses for taxicab drivers, certificates (annual and transfers, citations and no smoking violations. Additional revenue may be realized as a result of increasing the number of certificates annually by 10% in calendar years 2002-2006.

The estimated income for FY2000-01 is approximately \$86,400. For FY2001-2006, based on increases in certificates and additional licenses issued, the approximate positive fiscal impact would be as follows:

2005 - 2006	151,334

The first year positive fiscal impact will be offset by increased costs of approximately \$39,500 for cellulars, telephones/pagers, vehicles, gas and oil costs.
