(a) Section 104.3 is ame	nded to read as follows:
"104.3 Inspections. Subje	ct to the limitations and conditions as hereinafter stated in this
Section, it shall be the duty of	the Code Official to make, or cause to be made, inspections as

1 often as necessary to determine the conditions of dwellings, multifamily dwellings, dwelling 2 units, rooming houses, rooming units, and premises in order to safeguard the safety and welfare 3 of the public under the provisions of this Code. Such inspections shall be made in response to 4 citizen or official complaints or other reliable information or allegations of existing violations of 5 the Code. Further, inspections of dwellings, dwelling units, rooming houses, rooming units, and premises shall be made on a systematic basis (e.g., house by house, block by block) in areas, 6 7 communities, or neighborhoods when it is determined by the Code Official that such action is 8 necessary to properly apply and enforce the provisions of this Code. An investigation unit shall 9 be established to aid in the investigation of persistent and critical violations of this Code. The investigation unit shall consist of Department of Permitting, Inspections and Enforcement staff 10 11 and an advisory supervisor from the Prince George's County Department of the Environment 12 and the Revenue Authority. All reports of such inspections and investigations by the 13 investigation unit shall be in writing and shall be certified by a responsible officer of such 14 approved agency or by the responsible individual. The Code Official is authorized to engage such expert opinion as deemed necessary to 15 16 17 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby 18 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, 19 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of 20 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining 21 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this 22 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such 23 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, 24 or section. 25 SECTION 3.
