11	SECTION	1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
12	Maryland, that Se	ections 13-246.03, 13-246.04 and 13.246.05 of the Prince George's County Code

16		<b>DIVISION 7A. REGULATION OF INVASIVE</b>
17		BAMBOO.
18	<u>Sec. 13-246.03 –</u>	Definitions.
19	(a) For the p	purposes of this Division, the following words and phrase shall have the
20	following meanings indicated:	
21	(1) <b>Bamboo</b> means a perennial evergreen that belongs to the true grass family Poaceae,	

1	subfamily Bambusoideae; tribe Bambuseae.		
2	(2) Invasive Bamboo means bamboo that is characterized by aggressive spreading		
3	behavior, including bamboo species in the Genus Phyllostachys aureosulcata (yellow groove		
4	bamboo); otherwise known as running bamboo, Pleioblastus, Pseudosasa, and Bambusa.		
5	<u>Sec. 13-246.04 Regulation.</u>		
6	(1) In Prince George's County Council, no person may:		
7	(a) sell invasive bamboo;		
8	(b) plant invasive bamboo; or		
9	(c) allow invasive bamboo to spread to any adjoining property without proper upkeep		
10	and appropriate containment measures, including barriers or trenches.		
11	<u>Sec. 13-246.05 Enforcement.</u>		
12	(a) A person aggrieved by an alleged violation of this Division may file a written complaint		
13	(including in electronic format) with the County.		
14	(b) If the County issues a notice of violation to a property owner for growing bamboo in		
15	violation of 13-246.04, the property owner shall commence appropriate containment measures		
16	within six (6) months and shall complete the containment measures within twenty-four (24)		
17	months. Upon demonstration of appropriate containment measures or removal, the property		
18	owner may request a one-time six (6) month extension for completion.		
19	(c) Any individual(s) or property owner found in violation of this Division shall be subject		
20	to a civil fine of \$500.00 for the first violation and \$1,000 for each subsequent violation.		
21	(d) An individual(s) or property owner found in violation of this Division shall be required		
22	to mitigate any damage caused by invasive bamboo on their property that spreads to an adjoining		
23	property. Mitigation shall include, but not limited to, the cost of any running bamboo that grows		
24	beyond the boundaries of an individual's property.		
25	SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby		
26	declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,		
27	sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of		
28	competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining		
29	words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this		
30	Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such		
31	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,		

or section.

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SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that within ninety (90) days after the enactment of this Act, sufficient written an electronic notice shall go out to the Prince George's County Chamber of Commerce, the Prince George's County Department of the Environment (DoE), The Prince George's Parks and Recreation and any other recipients as determined by the Council. SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act <u>shall take effect on July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2025.</u>
