### PLANNING, ZONING & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0 (In favor: Council Members Dean, Bland, Dernoga, Exum and Peters)

Staff explained that this resolution approves an amendment to Chapter 26 of the Code of the City of Bowie concerning residential storage. The City adopted Ordinance 0-3-06 on April 3, 2006 for the purpose of increasing the maximum allowable floor area for accessory buildings from 150 to 200 square feet, decreasing the lot size upon which the size restriction is applicable from 30,000 to 20,000 square feet, and permitting roll-up garage doors for accessory buildings. Section 8-112.1 of Article 28 of the Maryland Annotated Code requires District Council approval of the City's ordinance before it becomes effective.

Sally Hein, representing the City of Bowie, was present to respond to Council Members' questions. Ms. Hein commented that there should be no non-conforming situations created as a result of the proposed amendments to the City's Code.

# **BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:**

Section 8-112.1 of Article 28 of the Maryland Annotated Code authorizes municipalities within the Maryland-Washington Metropolitan District to enact certain ordinances, including the regulation of outdoor storage, subject to the approval of the District Council. The proposed resolution approves the regulation of outdoor storage enacted by the City of Bowie.
