## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT:**

The proposed legislation establishes a process to sell light wine and beer in grocery establishments. Often times, Prince George's residents must visit neighboring jurisdiction's to purchase beer and light wine. For the purposes of identifying access points to fresh food, a food retailer may be defined as a retail establishment that offers for sale food products in at least five of the following six categories: (1) fresh fruits and vegetables, (2) fresh and uncooked meat, poultry, and seafood, (3) dairy products and (4) canned foods, (5) frozen foods and (6) dry groceries and baked goods. Moreover, statistics show that Prince George's County has been hardest hit by the pandemic health wise are the same places where the County has the least access to primary care physicians and general health care. These areas are the same places to have the least access to healthy food. Lastly, grocers may be attracted to local supermarkets if

they also sold beer and light wine, providing a one-stop shopping experience.
