<u>CB-37-2004 – AN ACT CONCERNING BUILDING CODE – GRADING DRAINAGE, AND POLLUTION CONTROL – ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS</u> for the purpose of amending the Building Code, Grading, Drainage, and Pollution Control, and Administrative Provisions portions of the County Building Ordinance. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 37 was presented by the Chairman at the request of the County Executive and referred to the Transportation, Housing and the Environment (THE) Committee.

<u>CB-81-2004 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING CONVEYANCES OF LAND BY THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA OR BY THE STATE OF MARYLAND</u> for the purpose of exempting certain land conveyed in fee simple by the University of Maryland from being immediately placed in the Reserved Open Space (R-O-S) Zone. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 81 was presented by Council Member 81 and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development (PZED) Committee.

<u>CB-82-2004 – AN ACT CONCERNING IMPOUNDMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES FROM PRIVATE PROPERTY</u> for the purpose of requiring that photographs be taken whenever a motor vehicle is impounded from private property under certain circumstances. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 82 was presented by Council Member Hendershot and referred to the Public Safety and Fiscal Management (PSFM) Committee.

<u>CB-83-2004 – AN ACT CONCERNING COURT SYSTEM – PRINCE GEORGE'S</u>
<u>COUNTY CRIMINAL JUSTICE COORDINATING COUNCIL</u> for the purpose of establishing the Prince George's County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council; providing for the purpose, membership, duties, quorum, and frequency if meetings of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council; providing that the function of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council is advisory, establishing reporting requirements; and generally relating to the Prince George's County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council. - *PRESENTED*
