METHODOLOGY IN CALCULATING AND SETTING TAX RATES ON PROPANE GAS

The briefing convened at 3:05 p.m. David Van Dyke, County Auditor, facilitated a PowerPoint presentation on his agency's special review of the Propane Tax Rate. The presentation outlined factors which have led to a higher rate than is warranted and recommended a reduction in the rate and

revision of the tax forms to clarify this issue. Linda Allen, Chief, Department of Treasury noted that the submittal forms have now been revised to clearly show that only Prince George's County consumption should be reported. The panelists responded to questions posed by the Council regarding: the process for approving the rate, comparison with other jurisdictions, commercial versus residential, potential residential/commercial differential, self-reporting system, and the new process of verification.
