RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

Proposed Potomac River Bridge Crossings

between Montgomery County, Maryland and Fairfax and Loudoun Counties in Virginia

For the purpose of advising the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) of the Prince George's

County Council's concerns regarding the proposed Potomac River Bridge Crossings feasibility

Study and requesting participation on the Advisory Panel of elected officials and the panel of
technical experts.

WHEREAS, Congress has appropriated \$2 million to the Federal Highway Administration for the study of potential highway bridge crossings between Montgomery County, Maryland and Fairfax and Loudoun Counties in Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration has convened an advisory panel of elected officials and a panel of technical experts from the District of Columbia, the states of Maryland and Virginia, and the counties of Montgomery, Frederick, Fairfax, and Loudoun to provide input to and review of the ongoing study; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Representatives Constance A. Morella, Albert Russell Wynn, and Steny H. Hoyer, have expressed "serious reservations about a major new highway crossing the Potomac River in Montgomery County" and have requested consideration of all alternatives including "transportation and land use alternatives that will maximize mobility for citizens and reduce single occupant vehicle use," as well as "the relative priority of an outer bridge project compared to other regional projects aimed at solving our transportation problems"; and

WHEREAS, a new major highway can affect regional development patterns and the distribution of economic investment; and

WHEREAS, the report by the Brookings Institution, "A Region Divided," highlighted the growing imbalance of jobs between the eastern and western halves of the Washington Metropolitan region; and

WHEREAS, Prince George's County has existing transportation infrastructure available to support development contiguous to the region's core, including four Metro lines and 13 stations, which can support reverse commutes to jobs located in Prince George's County; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the County Council expresses its strong interest in the potential long-term economic effects of new Potomac River bridge crossings and connecting major highways and requests that the Federal Highway Administration study include rigorous analysis of the potential effects of a Northern Potomac River Crossing on economic investment and development in Prince George's County as well as the region's core.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council hereby requests that any study include land use and transportation scenarios encompassing the entire Metropolitan region, including Prince George's County, that reinvest in the region's core communities and focuses future development at transportation centers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council hereby requests that the Federal Highway Administration study give strong consideration to a suburban circumferential Metrorail extension and a Potomac River Crossing South of the Woodrow Wilson Bridge as an alternative for traffic relief on the Beltway and as a means for supporting and stimulating economic investment in Prince George's County and the eastern half of the Washington Metropolitan region.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Council requests that Prince George's County be included as a member on the advisory panel of elected officials and on the panel of technical experts, so that the County's interests are fairly represented.
