WHEREAS, the Department of Justice has issued a Presolicitation Notice requesting			
private security companies to submit site surveys within the Maryland Counties of Prince			
George's, Anne Arundel, Montgomery, Howard, Baltimore and the City of Baltimore, and the

WHEREAS	WHEREAS, private corporations have submitted proposals for three properties in Prince		
George's County, to include the Cheltenham Property in Cheltenham, Maryland, the Eastgate			
Business Park in Forestville, Maryland, and the Mid-Atlantic Distribution Center in Brandywin

WHEREAS, the proposed sites in Prince George's County are in highly populated			

surrounding areas; and

WHEREAS, United States Senators Barbara Mikulski and Paul Sarbanes have indicated their strong opposition to the construction of a federal prison in the County; and
