6	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
7	Maryland, that Section 26.101 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
8	repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:
9	SUBTITLE 26. VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC.
10	DIVISION 1. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.
11	Sec. 26-101 Definitions.
12	(a) For the purposes of this Subtitle, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings
13	respectively ascribed to them hereunder:
14	* * * * * * * * *
15	(24) Watercraft means any vehicle or device which may transport a person on water
16	and shall be identified as, but not limited to:
17	(A) Bass Boats;
18	(B) <u>Fishing Boats</u> ;
19	(C) <u>Cabin Cruisers;</u>
20	(D) <u>Inflatable Boats;</u>
21	(E) <u>Pontoon Boats</u> ;
22	(F) <u>Deck Boats;</u>
23	(G) <u>Runabouts;</u>
24	(H) <u>Dinghies;</u>
25	(I) Any other personally or corporately owned and operated vehicle designed
26	to traverse water; and
27	(J) Any vehicle designed to traverse water that is parked on a trailer displaying
28	valid registration, invalid registration, or no registration.
29	(b) Whenever any words and phrases used herein are not defined herein but are defined in
30	the State laws regulating the operation of vehicles, any such definition therein shall be deemed
31	to apply to such words and phrases used herein, except when the context otherwise requires.

1	SECTION 2. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,
2	Maryland, that Section 26-135 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby
3	added:
4	SUBTITLE 26. VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC.
5	DIVISION 8. PARKING REGULATIONS.
6	Sec. 26-135 [Reserved.] Public parking of watercraft restricted; enforcement; penalty;
7	impounding.
8	(a) No person shall park any watercraft on any public County streets, roads, highways, or
9	rights-of-way at any time.
10	(b) Any owner found in violation of this Section shall be subject to the following penalties:
11	(1) A warning notice placed on the watercraft notifying the owner to remove the
12	watercraft off all public County streets, roads, highways, or rights-of-ways within seventy-two
13	(72) hours;
14	(2) A Two Hundred and Fifty Dollar (\$250) fine for a first offense; and
15	(3) A Five Hundred Dollar (\$500) fine for each subsequent citation issued.
16	(c) For the purpose of defining the penalty under this Section, each violation shall be
17	considered a separate offense and eligible for a separate citation Twenty-Four (24) hours after
18	the last citation was issued.
19	(d) Any watercraft that has not been moved from a public County street, road, highway, or
20	right-of-way after the second violation of this section may be subject to tow and impoundment
21	by the Revenue Authority or the County Police Department. The impoundment of the watercraft
22	shall be enforced pursuant to Division 18 of this Subtitle.
23	SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's
24	County, Maryland, that Section 26-162 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is
25	hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:
26	SUBTITLE 26. VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC.
27	DIVISION 14. ABANDONED VEHICLES.
28	Sec. 26-162. Abandoned vehicles prohibited.
29	(a) No person shall leave any abandoned vehicle at any place within the County and no
30	owner, lessee, or custodian in charge of any lot, field, road, street, lane, or other property shall
31	permit any abandoned vehicle to remain on such property within the County.

1	(b) Abandoned vehicle means any motor vehicle, trailer, <u>watercraft</u> , or semitrailer:
2	(1) That is <u>either</u> inoperable <u>or in disrepair</u> and left unattended on public
3	property for more than forty-eight (48) hours;
4	(2) That has remained illegally on public property for more than forty-eight (48)
5	hours;
6	(3) That has remained on public property for more than forty-eight (48) hours; and
7	(A) Is not displaying currently valid registration plates; and/or
8	(B) Is displaying registration plates of another vehicle; and/or
9	(C) Is in violation of Section 26-122.01of this Subtitle;
10	(4) That has remained on private property for more than forty-eight (48) hours; and
11	(A) Is inoperable in that one or more of its major mechanical components,
12	including but not limited to engine, transmission, drive train, and wheels, is missing or not
13	functional unless such vehicle is kept in an enclosed building or as permitted by Subtitle 13 or
14	Subtitle 27 of the Code; or
15	(B) Is not displaying currently valid registration plates; or
16	(C) Is displaying registration plates of another vehicle.
17	(c) Any partially dismantled, wrecked, or junked motor vehicle or watercraft may be
18	presumed to have been or be abandoned.
19	(d) Any person issued a citation for a violation of [this Section shall be subject to a fine of
20	Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each violation.] Section 26-162(a) shall be subject to a fine of one
21	hundred dollars (\$100) for a first violation, five hundred dollars (\$500) for a second violation
22	and one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for each additional violation.
23	(e) Curbstoning, as defined in Section 26-122.01 of this Subtitle, shall be subject to a fine of
24	up to One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for each offense.
25	(f) Any person issued a citation for a violation of this section may be subject to criminal
26	prosecution under Maryland Code, Criminal Law §10-110 for illegal dumping.
27	(g) The Revenue Authority of Prince George's County shall be authorized to enforce this
28	Code provision.
29	(h) The Department of Environment, the Police Department, or its agent responsible for
30	removing or storing abandoned vehicles on behalf of the Revenue Authority may not be held
31	liable for any damage to an abandoned vehicle that may occur during removal, storage, or

custody of the abandoned vehicle.

- (i) <u>Beginning on September 1st, 2025, the County's Department of Environment, the Department of Public Works & Transportation, the Revenue Authority, and the Police Department shall transmit a joint biannual report to the Council. The biannual report shall identify:</u>
- (1) The number of complaints reported through the County's 3-1-1 system under this section;
 - (2) The number of pending and resolved complaints under this section; and
- (3) <u>Any other relevant information pertaining to the removal, storing, impoundment, and disposal of abandoned vehicles.</u>

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 5. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
