SCHOOL PROJECTS for the purpose of authorizing Prince George's County, Maryland, to borrow money upon its full faith and credit at any time and from time to time, in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding Seven Hundred Five Million Sixty Five Thousand Dollars (\$705,065,000) to finance the construction, including the design, reconstruction, extension, acquisition, improvement, enlargement, alteration, renovation, relocation, rehabilitation, repair or modernization, of school buildings in the County; prescribing terms and conditions upon which bonds issued pursuant to this Act shall be issued and sold and other incidental details with respect thereto; and providing generally for the issuance of such bonds.

Public Hearing held; Enacted CB-41-2008 - AN ACT CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF
GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS for the purpose of authorizing and empowering Prince George's County, Maryland to issue and sell an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thirty-eight Million Three Hundred Thirty-two Thousand Dollars (\$138,332,000) in aggregate principal amount of general obligation bonds with serial maturities, including mandatory sinking fund installments in lieu of serial maturities, for the purpose of providing funds for financing in whole or in part costs of the planning, construction, reconstruction, establishment, extension, enlargement, demolition, improvement or acquisition of certain capital projects set forth in the capital budget of the County for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2009, or usable portions thereof, including describing the capital projects to be financed in whole or in part from the proceeds of the bonds hereby authorized and the estimated costs and probable useful lives thereof; prescribing or providing for the procedures for the issuance and sale of such bonds at public sale; declaring the County's official intent to

reimburse itself for certain expenditures paid before the issuance of the bonds authorized hereby in accordance with applicable Income Tax Regulations; authorizing the consolidation of such bonds with other bonds for purposes of such sale; showing compliance with the power of the County to incur indebtedness; directing the application of the proceeds of such bonds; pledging the full faith and credit and taxing power of the County to the payment of such bonds and providing for the levy and collection of taxes necessary for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds when due; authorizing and empowering the County to issue and sell an amount not to exceed One Hundred Thirty-eight Million Three Hundred Thirty-two Thousand Dollars (\$138,332,000)...
