## PUBLIC SAFETY & FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 11/2/00

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0, (In favor: Council Members Wilson, Estepp, Maloney, Russell and Scott).

This resolution is for supplementary appropriations for grant programs for FY2000-2001 in the amount of \$4,413,686.

The Health Department will receive an additional \$3 million in the Addiction Treatment Grant which will expand the services for addicted clients in the County.

The Department of Family Services' grants are increased by two new programs in the amount of \$147,272 and will expand the Mental Health Authority Grant by \$52,672.

The Police Department grant appropriation will increase by \$866,916 expanding the resources available for seven (7) existing grant programs and two new programs. A \$275,000 award will support the crime fighting "hot spot initiative" in communities where crime is concentrated and \$87,116 will support the Digital Imaging and Electronics Information Network Program.

The Office of Emergency Preparedness in the Fire/EMS Department will receive a \$24,065 grant to offset the County's participation in the National Capital Region 2000 Exercise.

The Office of Information Technology and Communications has been awarded \$3,000 to enhance a program to reduce unnecessary calls to 911.

The Department of Social Services received a grant of \$110,339 to assure payment accuracy within the Food Stamp Program.

The Office of the State's Attorney anticipates receiving funds in the amount of \$160,030 as a supplementary award for the Stop the Violence Program.

The Director of Finance has certified in writing that such funds are available or anticipated for these appropriations.

The Legislative Officer has reviewed the legislation and finds it to be in proper legislative form.

There should be a positive fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CR-59-2000.
