

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 11TH COVID COUNCIL RESOLUTION

Activity	Recommendations for Draft Resolution
Amusement Parks	For many establishments and activities, the recommendation is to remove rules regarding maximum capacity levels and simply state that persons must maintain 6 feet social distancing, except members of same household.
Banquet Halls, Receptions and Meeting Room in Hotels, Conference Centers and Similar Establishments	Maintaining 50% maximum capacity; it is in line with what State is doing. 50% Capacity applies to dining activities.
Bars, Nightclubs, and Adult Entertainment	See Amusement Parks
Bingo Halls	See Amusement Parks
Bowling Alleys	See Amusement Parks
Car Washes	<p>Fully Automatic: Customers must be able to remain in their cars while obtaining service, except when establishment employees are cleaning interior of the vehicle; Employees must wear face coverings and gloves</p> <p>Self-Service: Remain allowed to open</p>
Casinos & Gaming Facilities	See Amusement Parks. Must meet dining requirements of restaurants.

<p>Camps</p>	<p>Day Camps.</p> <p>a. General Requirements.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Only campers from Maryland, Virginia, and District of Columbia are permitted to attend youth camps in the County. ii. Participants must be separated into groups of 25 participants indoors and groups of 50 participants outdoors. Participants include all campers, staff, and any volunteers. Participants must not mix with members of another group in the camp. iii. Must have a COVID Protocol Plan that is approved by the Health Officer or the Health Officer’s designee for daily monitoring of the health and safety of campers and staff which includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A daily COVID-19 symptom and exposure attestation form to be completed by campers (or their parent/guardian) and staff. These forms must be maintained in such a manner to preserve confidentiality. 2. Excluding staff or campers, pursuant to CDC guidance, who have tested positive for COVID-19, are symptomatic, or who have had a known exposure to a confirmed case of COVID-19. 3. Adopting infection control strategies which include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Social distancing; b. Hand hygiene; c. Cough and sneeze hygiene; d. Proper use, removal, and washing of cloth face coverings; e. Providing policies and education on COVID-19 symptoms and response; f. Avoiding the use of items that are not easily cleaned and disinfected; g. Ensuring adequate supplies of tissues, hand soap, alcohol-based hand sanitizer, EPA approved cleaning products for COVID-19 disinfection suited for the facility; h. Effective cleaning and disinfection of surfaces; and i. regularly reviewing and incorporating into the Plan any CDC guidance for youth and summer camps that does not conflict with this Resolution. <p>Residential Camps. All residential youth camps must implement the following measures in addition to the measures described above:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Each group of campers/staff stays with their sleeping group, do not mix campers or staff among groups for the duration of the session. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Maximum capacity for each sleeping area is groups of 25 adults and campers. 2. For bunk beds, if both upper and lower beds are occupied, sleep with the top bunk individual’s head above the lower bunk individual’s feet. 3. Minimum of 6 feet between each occupied bunk or bed, provide maximum distance between each individual’s head. 4. Complete COVID-19 temperature and symptom screening for staff and campers every morning. ii. Residential camps with a COVID-19 positive or probable case will send all campers/staff in the group to their homes or quarantine in place with additional requirements based on consultation with the local health department.
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	iii. Clean and disinfect high touch surfaces in bathroom facilities and sleeping quarters daily.
Childcare	All licensed and authorized childcare programs are allowed to open pursuant to the rules and regulations established by the Maryland Department of Education, MDH, other applicable State authorities and/or the County Health Department. <i>See Camps</i> for summer camp information.
Cigar Bars/ Hookah Bars/ Vape Shops	<i>See Amusement Parks.</i> May open solely to sell retail goods. Smoking on site is strictly prohibited.
Concert Venues	Maintaining 50% maximum capacity; it is in line with what State is doing.
Face Coverings	<i>Consistent with CDC recommendations, residents of Prince George’s County who are fully vaccinated against the coronavirus no longer need to wear a mask outdoors while walking, running, hiking or biking alone, or when in small gatherings, including with members of their own households or other fully vaccinated individuals. Masks are still necessary and required in crowded outdoor venues like sports stadiums or outdoor concert venues.</i> <i>Unvaccinated residents are STRONGLY encouraged to get vaccinated and continue wearing their masks outdoors until they are fully vaccinated.</i> The other provisions, remain the same including Exceptions to the rule, i.e. disability, cannot impede communications for hearing impaired, etc.
Farmer’s Market	Open, maintaining proper social distancing, mask wearing and following CDC guidelines for cleaning high use surfaces.
Gyms, Fitness Centers, & Other Indoor Physical Activities	<i>See Amusement Parks.</i> Face coverings shall be worn when working out.
Indoor and Outdoor Pools (public and private)	<i>See Amusement Parks.</i> Need staff other than lifeguards to control social distancing.
Indoor Skating Rinks (roller and ice skating)	<i>See Amusement Parks.</i>

Large Gatherings (Indoors and Outdoors)	<p>Unless specifically stated otherwise:</p> <p>Indoor gatherings remain limited to 20 persons, for all locations and venues including private residences and other gatherings.</p> <p>Outdoor gatherings remain limited to 50 persons, for all locations and venues including private residences and other gatherings.</p> <p>Persons may apply to COVID Compliance Team for increased number of persons.</p>
Manufacturing	<p>Remain open; social distancing and other general requirements.</p>
Miniature Golf	<p>See Amusement Parks.</p>
Outdoor Recreational Activities	<p>May operate at 50% maximum capacity</p>
Personal Services (beauty salons, barber shops, tattoo parlors, massage parlors etc.)	<p>Barbershops and Beauty Salons: See Amusement Park; Appointment only; Customers are not allowed to congregate in common sitting area waiting to be served; Use of PPE, including face coverings and gloves, by all employees</p> <p>Other Personal Services (esthetic and nail services, tattoo services, tanning, massages, hot tub and sauna services): See Amusement Park; Appointment only; Use of PPE, including face coverings and gloves, by all employees;</p>
Places (Houses) of Worship	<p>See Amusement Park</p>
Pool Halls	<p>See Amusement Park; Pool sticks, racking equipment and balls must be sanitized between games.</p>
Professional and Collegiate Sporting Events	<p>The number of spectators is limited to no more than 50% of the capacity of the stadium. Tailgating is prohibited.</p>
Recreation Facilities (Indoor)	<p>See Amusement Parks.</p>
Restaurants	<p>Indoor and Outdoor Dining</p>

	See Amusement Parks. For at least 30 days to assist with contact tracing, restaurants must maintain a daily record of all patrons that consume food or beverages on premises; other general rules like sanitation remain.
Retail (Grocery Stores, Specialty Food Stores, Big Box, Shopping Malls, et.)	<i>All Retail (including large retail, grocery stores, & shopping malls)</i> See Amusement Parks.
Senior Centers	Senior Citizens allowed if fully vaccinated. Face covering and social distancing rules apply.
Social and Fraternal Clubs	For Dining, they follow the rules for restaurants. However, for conferences, banquets and meetings open to the public, they must follow 50% capacity rules.
Theaters	Indoor: Max capacity remains at 50% * Drive In Theaters: Required permitting, zoning or other applicable governmental authorization must be obtained; Maximum number of vehicles rule has been removed (Previously it was 100); Previous rule of maintaining 10 feet between vehicles is removed Customers must remain in their vehicles except to visit the restroom.
Tour Boats	See Amusement Parks; Staff and patrons upon disembarking the vessel, must wear face coverings, maintain social distance and follow other applicable rules
Youth and Amateur Sports (excluding schools per Governor's order)	All sports are categorized by level of risk (low, medium, high). All category of sports is allowed indoor and outdoor, subject to rules. Teams are limited to the players on the official rosters, coaches and up to 12 additional participants acting on an official game capacity. The number of spectators is limited. Number of persons present (apart from players, coaches, and others in official capacity) may not exceed 50 persons. Spectators may exceed 50 solely to accommodate the presence of two parents or guardians per youth participant
Other Nonessential Businesses	Are allowed to be open. Social distancing is required.
