FY 2024 Strategic Focus


The agency's top priorities in FY 2024 are:

- Increase the efficiency and responsiveness to County residents.
- Maintenance and sustainability of the new PGC311 CRM system.
- Expand resource services to all residents by implementing phase 3 of the 311 on the Go! Program to include interagency collaboration.
- Expansion of basic needs distribution program to County residents.
- Improve the quality of life in all County neighborhoods that face significant economic, health, public safety, and educational challenges.

COVID-19 Response

- **Donations (COVID-19):** In response to COVID-19, the Outreach & Programs Unit continues to disseminate **over 150,000** donated items to the community (countywide).
- Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP): With OCR's assistance, DHCD maintains the hotline whereas over 40,000 calls have been received.
- COVID-19 Test Kits: In order to prevent the spread of COVID-19, OCR worked with the Office of Homeland Security to distribute over 10,000 COVID-19 Test Kits.



Common Ownership Coc Communities

- Common Ownership Communities (COC): provides services to governing bodies, owners and residents of homeowners' associations, residential condominiums, and cooperative housing corporations. COC Commissioners hosted Community Conversations, distributed Community Toolkits, completed 32 conciliations and 1 formal Alternative Dispute Resolution
- EDvantage: to educate members of homeowners' associations, condominiums and cooperative housing corporations of their rights and responsibilities as unit owners. The EDvantage training program may be taken by any interested party, though it is specific to Prince George's County. Working alongside the Commission on Common Ownership Communities and the Office of Information and Technology, COC produced the much-anticipated training in both English and Spanish with voiceovers for the visually impaired. To date over 150 members of the community have completed EDvantage training program.



Outreach & Programs

- 100 Events of Summer in Summer 2022, OCR participated in **250** County community events; **27%** over Summer 2021. Over **15,000** Prince Georgians were impacted.
- Stuff-A-Truck 2022 in November 2022, OCR hosted its 6th annual Stuff-A-Truck Event at Ebenezer AME Church in Fort Washington, MD. Over 18,000 people were fed. Over 70,000 pounds of food was distributed over a span of two (2) days.
- Week of Wishes (W.O.W) formerly known as 12 Days of Giving. OCR hosted its first Week of Wishes focusing on gifting 48 County high-school seniors and 12th grade teachers with gifts.
- Winter Coat Drive OCR partnered with Enterprise Holdings and the Top Ladies of Distinction to provide new winter coats, hats, and gloves to 496 school aged kids.
- Class Act OCR partnered with Coca-Cola Consolidated and Staples to conduct its 1st Class Act 2023
 Initiative where we gifted 500 teachers with 24,620 resources and supplies needed to complete the remainder of the 2022-2023 school year.
- Senior Health is Wealth Initiative new initiative focusing on providing accelerated services for senior members of the community. To date Six (6) Senior Health is Wealth events have been held and close to 200 seniors have been engaged.





Special Projects


- Maintained, supported, and facilitated the CEX's Virtual Community Meeting Tour, serving upwards of (500) five-hundred residents.
- Continued (second cycle) of teen dating violence virtual training in partnership with the DFS and MNCPPC, "2022 Safe Dates Digital Academy," serving over (50) fifty youth.
- Continued to support and serve as a contributing partner/vendor for the 9th Annual "No Excuse for Dating Abuse," through SPD's established partnership with MNCPPC, serving over 3,300 (three thousand three hundred) residents.
- Created and hosted "Tuesday TALKS" in partnership with the Prince George's Community Federal Credit Union, providing fiscal information and services to upwards of (25) twenty-five residents via (3) three virtual sessions hosted on Tuesdays in July and August.
- Developed and hosted the first "SGA Day with the CEX" which was held at Crossland High School serving over (150) one-hundred and fifty students, representing the Prince George's Regional Association of Student Government (PGRASG), representing the following schools: Crossland High School, College Park Academy, Non-Traditional Program South, Charles Carroll Middle School, Parkdale High School, Duvall High School, Central High School, Suitland High School, Surrattsville High School, Greenbelt Middle School, Bowie High School, Gwynn Park Middle School, Oxon Hill High School, Potomac High School, and Charles Flowers High School.


Call Volume






311 Call Center Cont'd

311 Call Center Cont'd


Percentage of Calls Abandoned
