This Resolution will provide supplemental appropriations of Federal, State and other funds in the amount of $\$ 2,713,131$ for FY 2010. The additional appropriations will support new and/or continuing grant program efforts for the following five County Agencies:

1. Police Department.

(Traffic Safety Program (DUI), "Smooth Operator" waves, "Click it or Ticket", and seatbelt/aggressive driving saturation patrol)
2. Office of Homeland Security .\$2,158,518
(700 Megahertz Radio Interoperability System Upgrades, purchase software, fixed radio equipment, radio dispatch consoles and P25 Radio System)
3. Office of the Sheriff .\$18,000
(Maryland State Badges for Baseball Program (multi-faceted crime prevention and mentoring program.)
4. Health Department.................................................................\$256,000
(Support programs within the Office of the Health Officer and Epidemiology)
5. Department of Public Works and Transportation. \$160,613
(Security Awareness and Behavior Recognition Training)
Total. \$2,713,131

The Office of Law has reviewed this resolution and finds it to be in proper legislative form with no legal impediments to its adoption.

The grant appropriations reflect $\$ 2,674,131$ in direct Federal allocations, $\$ 34,000$ in State allocations and $\$ 5,000$ in other funding source. There are no County funds appropriated.

The adoption of CR-85-2010 will not have a negative fiscal impact on the County.
