





## COVID-19 Status Update by County – as of April 13, 2020




#### COVID-19 UM Capital Overall Experience – as of April 12, 2020



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COVID-19 Overall Experience – as of April 13, 2020




## COVID-19 UM Capital: + Cases by Gender – April 12, 2020





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
#### COVID-19 UM Capital: + Cases by Age Group – April 12, 2020




#### COVID-19 UM Capital: + Cases by Race/Ethnicity - April 12, 2020



#### COVID-19 UM Capital: + Cases by Zip Code – April 12, 2020



## UM PGHC Surge Escalation Overview

The need to activate a new surge level will be escalated to the Hospital Incident Command Structure. Determination will be based on three primary factors:

- Physical capacity and the need to expand to new locations within or external to the building
- Staffing resource availability
- Availability of SPE (Supplies, Pharmaceutical and Equipment)




UM Capital leaders featured on WUSA9 news coverage of area response to COVID-19


