AN EMERGENCY	ACT concerning	
	Non-Departmental Grants and Transfer Payments	
For the purpose of providing conditions upon the use of certain funds appropriated for		
Dimensions Health	care Systems, Inc.	
WHEREAS, on November 25, 2003, the County Council, in partnership with the County		
Executive, enacted CB-98-2003, to provide for an immediate cash infusion of \$5 Million to		
stabilize the fiscal situation of Dimensions Healthcare Systems, Inc. ("Dimensions Healthcare")		
and stands ready to continue an active and appropriate role in planning, funding, and overseeing		
appropriate corrective action in the County's healthcare delivery; and		
WHEREAS, Maryland Governor Robert L. Ehrlich, Jr. and County Executive Jack B.		
Johnson negotiated and executed a Memorandum of Understanding dated February 20, 2004,		
which Memorandum of Understanding was amended on April 19, 2004, to formulate a Financial		
Action Plan and provide additional oversight for Dimensions Healthcare in an effort to preserve		
the financially strapped Prince George's Hospital Center; and		
WHEREAS, the Memorandum of Understanding, as amended, provides for the		
appropriation of \$5 Million by the County in Fiscal Year 2005 and for the engagement of a		
management consultant to develop and implement a Recovery/Restructuring Plan; and		
WHEREAS, the County Council has determined that the funds appropriated in Fiscal Year		
2005 Budget should be subject to certain conditions and restrictions to ensure that public policy		

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,

priorities of the County are afforded appropriate consideration.

Maryland, that the following conditions shall attach and apply to the appropriation in the Non-

Departmental, Grants and Transfer Payments of \$5 Million for Dimensions Healthcare Systems,

Inc.:

- A. No portion of the funds appropriated may be used for funding pension obligations;
- B. \$150,000 of the funds appropriated shall be used for the Cora B. Woods Senior Health Center; and
- C. Not more than \$2 Million may be used for the hiring of the management consultant identified in the Memorandum of Understanding between the County and the State dated February 20, 2004, as amended, to provide and implement the Recovery/Restructuring Plan.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that in accordance with the provisions of Section 317 of the Charter, the County Council hereby declares that a public emergency exists affecting the public health, safety, and welfare; said emergency being emergency being the need to provide funding to Dimensions Healthcare in order to support the continuation of essential health services for the citizens and residents of Prince George's County. As the largest provider of inpatient and emergency services, Dimensions Healthcare is a cornerstone in the health care system in the County. Access to quality health care for the citizens and residents of the County depends on the continuation of Dimensions Healthcare services. For the past several years, Dimensions Healthcare has been facing serious financial difficulties resulting in significant operating losses. County funding in Fiscal Year 2005, in the amount of \$5,000,000 is necessary to assist Dimensions Healthcare in funding vital short-term operating needs that could affect access to care.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on the date it becomes law.

Adopted this <u>22nd</u> day of <u>June</u>, 2004, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the full County Council.
