**BILL**

1 AN ACT concerning

2 See It, Snap It, Get Paid Act of 2026

3 For the purpose of establishing a Prince George’s County Beautification Enforcement Incentive  
4 Program to enhance the aesthetic conditions and environmental quality and well-being of Prince  
5 George’s County; and generally relating to civil enforcement.

6 BY adding:

7 SUBTITLE 28. CIVIL MONETARY FINES OR PENALTIES.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,  
12 Maryland, that Section 28-269 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby  
13 added:

14 **SUBTITLE 28. CIVIL MONETARY FINES OR PENALTIES.**

15 **DIVISION 3. - MISCELLANEOUS CIVIL VIOLATIONS.**

16 **SUBDIVISION 3. BEAUTIFICATION ENFORCEMENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM.**

17 **Sec. 28-269. Beautification Enforcement Incentive Program.**

18 (a) Purpose. The Director of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement shall establish a  
19 Beautification Enforcement Incentive Program to support code enforcement and enhance the  
20 aesthetic conditions and environmental quality and well-being of Prince George’s County by  
21 increasing enforcement of beautification laws.

1        (b) Program and Incentive. The Beautification Enforcement Incentive Program shall consist  
2 of the following:

3            (1) The Director of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement shall prescribe and publish  
4 on the Department website the method for submitting civilian complaints with supporting  
5 photographic evidence.

6            (2) The photographic evidence submitted in accordance with paragraph (1), above, shall  
7 be recorded on a photograph, electronic image, video or videotape, or any other medium as  
8 determined by the Director. The Director is authorized to prescribe additional specifications for  
9 the image to capture the necessary details to qualify as potential evidence in sustaining a civil  
10 violation of Sections 13-265, 23-151, 23-152, 23-608, or 23-610 of this Code.

11            (3) If photographic evidence submitted by a resident domiciled in Prince George's  
12 County who is not employed by the Prince George's County Government in accordance with the  
13 method established pursuant to paragraphs (1) and (2), above, results in a civil monetary fine  
14 being issued and collected for a civil violation of Sections 13-265, 23-151, 23-152, 23-608, or  
15 23-610, the submitting individual shall be entitled to fifty percent (50%) of the civil monetary  
16 fine collected for the violation.

17            (4) The Office of Finance shall remit to the submitting individual the amount to which  
18 the individual is entitled under paragraph , provided that:

19            (A) the Director of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement shall determine in  
20 writing in the Director's best judgement that the image submitted by the resident is a  
21 substantially contributing factor to the determination of a violation of Sections 13-265, 23-151,  
22 23-152, 23-608, or 23-610; and

23            (B) the amount of the civil monetary fine has been fully collected by the County.

24            (5) Where the Director of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement determines that more  
25 than one resident has submitted photographic evidence that is a substantially contributing factor  
26 to the determination of a violation of Sections 13-265, 23-151, 23-152, 23-608, or 23-610, the  
27 amount remitted in accordance with Paragraph (1), above, shall be equally divided among such  
28 residents.

29            (c) The Director of Permitting, Inspections, and Enforcement is authorized to establish  
30 additional regulations, practices, and procedures to implement this Section that are not  
31 inconsistent with the provisions of this Section.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection, or section.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
