## RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION concerning

State of Maryland Community Legacy Program

For the purpose of approving the application and receipt of financing by Prince George's County, Maryland, to the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development for funding through the Community Legacy Financial Assistance Fund.

WHEREAS, Prince George's County, Maryland (the "County") recognizes that there is a significant need for reinvestment and revitalization of the communities of the County; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-201 through Section 6-213 of the Housing and Community Development Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, established the Community Legacy Program to preserve existing communities as desirable places to live and conduct business and provide financial assistance to sponsors for the development of community legacy plans or community legacy projects; and

WHEREAS, Section 6-206(b)(1) of the Housing and Community Development Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, provides that the Community Legacy Board may not approve an application for participation in the Community Legacy Program unless the application is approved by the local government; and

WHEREAS, the County is applying to the Maryland Department of Housing and
Community Development, Community Legacy Program, for funds to carry out the Langley Park
Streetscaping and Beautification project (the "Project"), as described in Attachment "A" and
incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Project will provide landscaping and streetscape improvements such as sidewalks, tree plantings, and street furniture, thereby enhancing safety and improving aesthetics

to contribute to the reinvestment and revitalization of this area; and

WHEREAS, the Project is located within a priority funding area under Section 5-7B-02 of the Smart Growth Act and the Project will conform to the local zoning code; and

WHEREAS, the County Executive, by his signature, expresses approval of the application submitted by Prince George's County, Maryland.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, hereby expresses support and approval of the application of Prince George's County, Maryland submitted to the Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development for participation in the Community Legacy Program in the approximate amount of \$199,677.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to the Secretary of the Department of Housing and Community Development of the State of Maryland for consideration by the Community Legacy Board.

PROJECT INFORMATION SHEET Prince George's County Department of Housing and Community Development ("DHCD") Langley Park Community Legacy Application: Streetscape Improvements and Beautification Projects along 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue, 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Langley Way

APPLICANT:

Prince George's County on behalf of the Prince George's County Department of Public Works and Transportation

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** Community Legacy (CL) funds are requested to construct streetscape improvements and beautification projects along 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue. 15<sup>th</sup> Avenue and Langley Way in the Census Designated Place of Langley Park. These roadways serve the community as major connectors between housing, shopping centers, and employment areas. Much of the existing physical infrastructure in Langley Park is an impediment to pedestrian mobility between destinations. The poorly designed urban form includes limited tree cover, uncovered bus stops, unpaved pedestrian walkways, consistently damaged grass cover and dangerous street crossings. Taken together these community characteristics interact to form an unsafe and uninviting pedestrian environment in which to live, work and commute. This proposal is designed to ensure timely and focused safety and aesthetic improvements to major pedestrian corridors.

> The goal of the project is to provide pedestrian safety improvements and streetscape enhancements to the corridors in the Langley Park community. In addition, a public realm/community gathering space in the areas fronting the CASA de Maryland Headquarters will be created. Work includes, but is not limited to, providing all labor, materials and services required to provide full professional landscape and hardscape installation. The scope of work will include 5ft wide concrete sidewalks; ADA compliant curb cuts and crosswalks; 3ft Brick retaining wall; Streetscape items- mature trees and shrubbery; Street Benches; and Concrete Pavers.
