FISCAL POLICY & GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS
COMMITTEE REPORT

Date: October 30, 1991

Committee Vote: Favorable, 5-0 (In favor: Council Members Wineland,
Castaldi, Del Giudice, Fletcher, and MacKinnon)

The funds were received through the Maryland Department of Transportation under an agreement with the Federal Highway Administration for Intensive Truck Safety Inspection. These funds provided for County Police Officers to conduct intensive truck safety inspections during overtime hours. The purpose was to create a short-term "strike force" to focus on the operation of unsafe interstate carriers and heavy duty refuse and construction vehicles on secondary routes located within the County. Grant funding was provided from FY91 Federal grant funds which expired September 30, 1991. Also, the short-term strike force has been disbanded.

The Office of Finance has certified in writing that the funds are available.

The Legislative Officer and the Office of Law have reviewed this legislation and find it to be in proper legislative form.

The fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CR-84-1991 will be positive in the amount of \$20,000.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

The Police Department has received a \$20,000 Federal grant award through the Maryland Department of Transportation for intensive truck safety enforcement. This resolution will provide authorization for expenditure of the grant funds.
