<u>CB-64-2003 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING RESIDENTIAL REGULATIONS</u> for the purpose of extending a sunset provision pertaining to the minimum lot size requirements for certain residential lots recorded prior to November 29, 1949. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 64 was presented by Council Member Hendershot and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee.

<u>CB-65-2003 - AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING RETAIL USES</u> for the purpose of permitting retail uses in the R-R and I-3 Zones under certain circumstances by repealing and reenacting with amendments. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 65 was presented by Council Member Dean and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee.
