25	testimony on April 8, 2010; and
26	WHEREAS, on April 26, 2010, the Planning Board, in consideration of the public hearing
27	testimony, adopted the master plan with revisions, as described in Prince George's County
28	Planning Board Resolution PGCPB No. 10-44, and transmitted the plan to the District Council
29	on April 26, 2010; and
80	WHEREAS, the District Council held work sessions on June 1, 2010 and June 15, 2010, to
31	consider hearing testimony; and

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WHEREAS, upon consideration of the testimony received through the hearing process, the District Council determined that the adopted plan should be approved as the functional master plan for water resources for Prince George's County, Maryland, and recommended additional revisions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that sitting as the District Council for that part of the Maryland-Washington Regional District in Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Adopted Prince George's County Water Resources Functional Master Plan, as amended herein, is hereby approved with the following amendments and revisions:

AMENDMENTS TO THE ADOPTED WATER RESOURCES FUNCTIONAL MASTER **PLAN**

AMENDMENT 1

Chapter IV: Growth Policies and Land Use Planning

1. page 53: Amend language Policy 1, Strategy 4. [Adjust] Maintain the growth targets within the General Plan to target [the majority of] new growth within the Developed Tier; [reduce] direct growth in the Developing Tier [outside of] to designated Centers and Corridors; and maintain little to no growth in the Rural Tier.

AMENDMENT 2

Chapter IV: Growth Policies and Land Use Planning

- 1. page 54: Amend language Policy 2, Strategy 2.
 - 2. Develop a **more robust** environmental checklist that requires developers to demonstrate that their development proposal [is consistent with] meets watershed goals and improves or does not damage, inclusive of mitigation, the overall health of all water resources, proximate to **the development**, within the watershed.

AMENDMENT 3

Chapter VII: Stormwater

- page 139: Amend language Policy 1, Strategy 4 Establish [maximums] targets for impervious percentages within defined watersheds, subwatershed, and catchment areas based on land use and watershed conditions.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the staff is authorized to make appropriate text and map revisions to correct identified errors, and reflect updated information.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the provisions of this Resolution are severable. If any provision, sentence, clause, section, or part thereof is held illegal, invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable, such illegality, invalidity, unconstitutionality, or unenforceability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections, or parts hereof or their application to other zones, persons, or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this Resolution would have been adopted as if such illegal, invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable provision, sentence, clause, section, or part had not been included therein.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall take effect on the date of its adoption.
