Departmental Victim Services Provided

Under Maryland State Law, Officers are responsible for directing citizens to appropriate community resources.

- During initial contact, a Patrol Officer will provide victims of a crime with a Crime Victim & Witness Pamphlet
 - Given to victims to assist them in understanding their rights as a victim
 - Officers will also provide guidance on how to obtain court orders (Peace Order, Ex Parte Order, etc.)

For more serious crimes, CAFY is the primary advocacy group that is used

- Primarily used for victims of the types of crimes that normally go to the Family Justice Center.

Mobile Crisis Team

- Aids those who are suffering some type of mental crisis
- Can be self dispatched
- Summoned by patrol officers

SAO Referrals

- Various Programs

Departmental Victim Services Provided (Cont.)

Hope in Action

Faith Based Partnership Lead by Pastor Tony Lee (REFERRALS)

- Hope Collective – grants given to 23 organizations to assist in the following
 - Adult/Juvenile re-entry
 - Mental health
 - Youth engagement
 - Medical based case management treatment
 - Adult/youth – helps get in front of retaliation
- Large group of organizations collaborating
- Violence Interrupters

Departmental Victim Services Provided (Cont.)

U-Visa

- Gives PD a tool in detecting, investigating, and prosecuting crimes against non-immigrants

Eligibility

- Must show they were a victim of a qualifying crime
- Have specific knowledge and details of the crime and has been, is being, or is likely to be helpful to law enforcement in the detection, investigation or prosecution of the crime
- Gives non-immigrants a temp visa to remain in the US for up to 4 years
- Non-immigrants can apply for permanent residency after 3 years

Other Departmental Services Provided

Office of Community First Programs

The Office of Community First offers several services which aim at educating the residents on crime prevention and help promote a healthy environment for all our citizens. Those services include:

- Triad/ SALT
- Police Athletic League
- Law Enforcement Explorers Program
- Real Talk
- Leadership and Life Summer Camp

Other Departmental Services Provided

Office of Community First Programs

TRIAD/ SALT: Theft from Auto's, Financial Crimes, Scams, Identity Theft

Triad/SALT is the cooperation between law enforcement and seniors in the Community to reduce criminal victimization. Triad is a nationally recognized program established to promote a three-way commitment among local law enforcement, sheriffs, and our older citizens to work together to reduce crime and offer services. SALT interchangeably stands for Seniors and Law enforcement Together. This group works together to exchange information for the safety of our seniors.

Other Departmental Services Provided (Cont.)

Office of Community First Programs

PAL(Police Athletic/Activities League): Early Youth Intervention/ Crime Prevention

The Prince George's County Police Athletic League is a juvenile crime prevention program that uses mentoring, educational, athletic and recreational activities to create trust and understanding between law enforcement and youth. This program promotes a healthy environment for the youth of Prince George's County under the supervision of law enforcement professionals. PAL assists our youth in developing character, integrity and leadership skills, as well as respect for themselves and others. PAL provides a safe alternative to drugs, alcohol and tobacco and gang activity.

PAL Programming: Badges for Baseball Mentor Program, Young Entrepreneurs, Innovative Outlets, Tennis, Summer baseball camp, T-TAC, Elite Basketball, Skills and Drills Basketball Summer Camp, Marital Arts, Running Club, Soccer Club, Speed and Agility Summer Camp, Outdoor Club.

Other Departmental Services (Cont.)

Office of Community First Programs

The Office of Community First offers several services that provide assistance to citizens in need throughout Prince Georges County. Those services include

- Annual Backpack Giveaway - Over 800 backpacks collected and donated
- Annual Coat Drive- Over 200 coats collected and donated
- Annual Sock, Hat and Glove Drive - Over 15,000 Socks, Hat and Gloves collected and donated
