A RESOLUTION concerning

The approval of the Fiscal Year 2016 Operating and Capital Budgets of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission and the Recommendation of Water and Sewer Rates and Ad Valorem Tax Levies for Fiscal Year 2016

For the purpose of adopting the Fiscal Year 2016 Operating and Capital Budgets of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission and the recommended Water and Sewer Rates and Ad Valorem Tax Levies for Fiscal Year 2016.

WHEREAS, Section 17-202 of the Public Utilities Article, Annotated Code of Maryland establishes a procedure for the preparation, review and approval of the annual capital and operating budgets of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission, and further provides for recommendations by the Montgomery and Prince George's County Councils regarding the rates for water consumption and sewer usage charges and the ad valorem tax levies of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, on March 1, 2015, the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission submitted to the County Executives of Montgomery and Prince George's Counties its proposed capital and operating budgets for Fiscal Year 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Commission forwarded to the County Executives of both Counties the record of the public hearings held by the Commission regarding its budget proposal; and

WHEREAS, the County Executives of Montgomery and Prince George's Counties transmitted their recommendations on the Commission's proposed budget, including the record of the public hearings held by the Commission, to the respective County Councils; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council, upon due public notice, held a public

hearing on the Commission's proposed budget on April 14, 2015, at which interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard by the Prince George's County Council; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council, following review of said budgets, approved, proposed additions to, deletions from, increases and decreases from items contained in the proposed budgets and transmitted these proposed changes to the Montgomery County Council by letter dated May 5, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council received on May 5, 2015, from the Montgomery County Council its approved proposed additions to, deletions from, and increases and decreases from items in the Commission's proposed budgets; and

WHEREAS, on May 7, 2015, the Montgomery and Prince George's County Councils jointly reviewed the respective proposed additions to, deletions from, and increases and decreases regarding items in said submitted capital and operating budgets and further considered all proposed changes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the following amounts and positions, or as much thereof as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby approved for the budget of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2016:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Capital and Operating Budgets include the

following changes to the proposed budgets recommended by the respective County Councils:

1. Allocated WSSC's proposed \$4.0 million for compensation in FY16 with a 2.0% cost of living adjustment and 3.5% step increase for eligible employees (effective July 1, 2015).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in implementing the above operating budget, the Commission shall establish its work program priorities within the dollar and work-year levels approved herein; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission is authorized to increase the water and sewer operating reserve by \$6.3 million; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in adopting its Fiscal Year 2016 Operating Budget, the Counties and the Commission recognize that although total operating debt service is \$255,310,000 and equals 35.7% of the total operating budget, water and sewer operating debt service, the portion of debt service supported by water and sewer rate revenues is \$235,574,000 or 34.0% of the water and sewer operating budget; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Prince George's County Council joins with the Montgomery County Council in recommending to the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission the following:

- 1. Average rate increase for Water Consumption and Sewer Usage charge: 1.0%.
- 2. Infrastructure Investment Fees of \$2.00 Per Month for a residential customer with a 34 inch meter. Fee varies by meter size.
- 3. Increase Account Maintenance Fees by \$1.67 Per Month for a residential customer with a ¾ inch meter. Fee varies by meter size.
- 4. The Water and Sewer Usage charges will be based on a water production rate of 166.0 million gallons per day; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any supplements to the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission's Approved Fiscal Year 2016 budget shall be in accordance with the provisions of Section 17-202 of the Public Utilities Article, Annotated Code of Maryland; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Commission shall:

- 1. Obtain the approval of both County Councils before increasing operating expenditures above \$715,173,000.
- 2. Obtain the County Councils' approval prior to making any transfer of funds from any of the approved expenditure categories within the operating and

- capital budgets in excess of five percent (5%) of the approved amounts. The amount approved for debt service is excluded from this transfer authority.
- 3. Furnish monthly status reports to each County Council and County Executive as to the fiscal and budgetary activities of the Commission pursuant to the Approved Operating and Capital Budgets, commencing with the end of the first quarter of the fiscal year. These reports shall be submitted not more than 45 calendar days after the close of each month.
- 4. Engage a consultant to assist with the performance of a Bench Mark Study to review services, programs, cost drivers and planning documents of the Commission as compared to industry best practices and applicable benchmarking metrics. This review will identify appropriate benchmarks for comparisons and conduct a review of the effectiveness and efficiency of the Commission's activities. Both Councils will be briefed on the results of the study and will jointly determine whether to further study additional phases.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Approved Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission FY 2016 Water and Sewer Rate Schedule (Appendix C), Approved Fees and Charges (Appendix D), and System Development Charge (Appendix E) are hereby approved, attached and incorporated by reference; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Commission may find it necessary from time to time or on an emergency basis to adopt further orders or resolutions in connection with its Fiscal Year 2016 Budget and/or the water and sewer use rates to be effective July 1, 2015, pursuant to its authority under the Laws of the Washington Suburban Sanitary District, Public Utilities Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.
