**BILL**

1 AN ACT concerning

2           The Federal Worker Emergency Assistance Act of Prince George's County

3 For the purpose of establishing emergency financial assistance, job placement support, and  
4 essential services for laid-off federal workers residing in Prince George's County, ensuring  
5 stability and access to critical resources during periods of economic hardship.

6 BY adding:

7                           SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.

8                           Sections 10-360, 10-361, 10-362, 10-363, 10-364,  
9                           10-365, 10-366

10                          The Prince George's County Code  
11                          (2023 Edition; 2024 Supplement).

12           SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,  
13 Maryland, that Sections 10-360, 10-361, 10-362, 10-363, 10-364, 10-365, and 10-366, of the  
14 Prince George's County Code be and the same are hereby added:

15                           **SUBTITLE 10. FINANCE AND TAXATION.**

16                           **DIVISION 35. FEDERAL WORKER EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE.**

17                           **SUBDIVISION 1. FEDERAL WORKER EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE.**

18 **Sec. 10-360. Legislative findings and declaration of purpose.**

19           The County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, hereby finds that Prince  
20 George's County is home to over 30,000 of federal employees whose livelihoods are impacted

1 by government layoffs, furloughs, or shutdowns; sudden job loss can lead to financial insecurity,  
 2 housing instability, and difficulty accessing essential services such as healthcare, utilities, and  
 3 food; the County Council seeks to establish a comprehensive local safety net to assist laid-off  
 4 federal workers in maintaining economic stability and transitioning to new employment  
 5 opportunities.

6 **Sec. 10-361. Definitions.**

7 (a) “Laid-Off Federal Worker” means a Prince George’s County resident who was  
 8 employed by the federal government and has been involuntarily terminated, furloughed, or had  
 9 their employment contract suspended without pay due to the acts of the President Trump’s  
 10 Administration, including but not limited to The Department of Government Efficiency  
 11 (“DOGE”).

12  
 13 (b) “Participating Employer” refers to a local business or entity that commits to hiring or  
 14 training laid-off federal workers under this Act.

15 **SUBDIVISION 2. EMPLOYMENT AND JOB TRAINING ASSISTANCE.**

16 **Sec. 10-362. Federal Worker Job Recovery Initiative.**

17 (a) Employ Prince George's (unless another agency or entity is designated for such  
 18 purpose by the County Executive), shall establish a “Federal Worker Job Recovery Initiative”,  
 19 which offers:

20 (1) Priority hiring for County government positions for eligible applicants.  
 21 However such priority shall not impact the hiring preference of current County employees.

22 (2) A local business hiring incentives such as providing tax credits to Prince  
 23 George’s County businesses that hire laid-off federal workers.

24 (3) Free workforce training and career transition support at Prince George’s  
 25 Community College.

26 **SUBDIVISION 3. FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS.**

27 **Sec. 10-363. Expansion of Food Assistance Programs.**

28 The County shall establish a “Federal Worker Food Assistance Program”, expanding access  
 29 to food banks and creating a voucher program in partnership with local grocery stores.

30 **SUBDIVISION 4. IMPLEMENTATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAMS.**

31 **Sec. 10-364. Implementation and administration.**

1        (a) The County Executive shall designate an appropriate agency to oversee the  
2 implementation of these programs and ensure effective distribution of resources.

3        (b) The County shall establish a dedicated online portal and in-person application centers  
4 to assist laid-off workers in applying for aid.

5 **Sec. 10-365. Financing the programs.**

6        The program shall be funded through a combination of County appropriations, state and  
7 federal grants, and private sector partnerships.

8                                    **SUBDIVISION 5. REPORTING PROVISIONS OF THE PROGRAMS.**

9 **Sec. 10-366. Reporting.**

10        (a) The County Executive shall provide an annual report to the County Council detailing:

- 11                    (1) The number of workers assisted.
- 12                    (2) The effectiveness of job placement and relief programs.
- 13                    (3) Recommendations for program improvements or extensions.

15        SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act shall remain in  
16 effect for three years from its enactment, subject to reauthorization based on the County’s  
17 economic conditions and workforce needs.

18        SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby  
19 declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,  
20 sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of  
21 competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remaining  
22 words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this  
23 Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such  
24 invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,  
25 or section.

26        SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45)  
27 calendar days after it becomes law.
