For the purpose of	of expressing the County Council's opposition to construction of the
Intercounty Conn	nector (ICC)
WHER	EAS, the Brookings Institution report, "A Region Divided" found that
the Washington r	egion is divided by jobs, income, and economic opportunity, with the
eastern half, inclu	ading much of Prince George's County, facing a lack of jobs and
economic opport	unity, while the western portion of the region, including Montgomery
County, faces rap	oid economic growth; and
WHEREAS	, a 2001 report by the Council of Governments found the expansion of I-
270 in the late 19	80's coincided with a shift of job growth away from Washington, DC
and Prince Georg	e's County to the I-270 corridor; and
WHEREAS	, the ICC would draw economic investment and jobs out of Prince
George's County	to Montgomery County and the I-270 corridor; and
WHEREAS	, studies provided by the Transportation Solutions Group and the State
Highway Admini	stration indicate that such a highway would not relieve Beltway traffic
in any significant	way and would leave many intersections at both ends of the proposed
ICC badly conge	sted; and
WHEREAS	, the proposed Master Plan alignment for the ICC has severe

environmental impacts; and

WHEREAS, in September 1999, after an 18-month review that included input from local government officials, the Transportation Solutions Group provided a report containing recommendations to address East-West transportation issues; and

WHEREAS, a combination of link, intersection, land use, and transit improvements, including the Inner Purple Line, are viable alternatives to construction of the ICC, a new highway that has been determined would result in unacceptable environmental impacts; and

WHEREAS, travel data indicates that the projected trips in Prince George's County are highly varied in origin and destination and do not justify the need for a continuous East-West highway; and

WHEREAS, on September 22, 1999, after review of the report of the Transportation Solutions Group, Governor Parris N. Glendening announced that he would not support the construction of the ICC between I-95 and I-270, and proposed a combination of link, intersection, and transit improvements which are currently in various stages of design and construction; and

WHEREAS, on December 14, 2001, the Prince George's County Council, County Executive and Chairman of the Prince George's County Transportation Oversight Committee submitted the Joint Signature letter on State Transportation Priorities to the Secretary of the Maryland Department of Transportation, supporting project planning for alternatives to the construction of the ICC between I-95 and I-270, including an East-West Link between US 29 and US 1 and transit service improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Council has authority over the development and approval of Master Plans that provide the basis for land use and related transportation decisions in Prince George's County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Council opposes the construction of the ICC between I-95 and I-270 on its proposed Master Plan alignment as well as any alternative alignments that are not shown in the Master Plan and supports alternatives to the ICC, including link, intersection, and transit improvements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the effective date of this resolution, it shall be transmitted by the Clerk of the Council to the Governor, Federal Highway
