WHEREAS, the Prince George's County Office of Central Services contracted with MGT

1	Consulting Group to conduct a Prince George's County Utilization and Availability Study				
2	("County Disparity Study"), released in December of 2019, which assessed racial and ethnic				
3	disparities between availability and outcomes in public and private sector opportunities in Prince				
4	George's County from 2010 to 2018; and

6	WHEREAS, Recommendation (H) of the County Disparity Study encourages the County				
7	to partner with third parties to improve the capacity of small, minority, and women owned firms.				
8	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County,				
9	Maryland, that Section 10-366 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby				
10	repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

17	There is a Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Program				
18	consisting of the Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund				
19	and the programs set forth under this Section. All funding set forth under this Section is limited				
20	to monies appropriated in the County Budget. Total assistance from the Prince George's				
21	County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund in any fiscal year for a business				
22	shall not exceed \$250,000 and any award is a non-renewable award.				
23	(a) <u>Definitions</u> .				
24	(1) Locally-Owned and Operated Business, in this Division, shall have the same				
25	meaning as defined in Section 10A-101(a)(24.1) of this Code.				
26	(2) Local Start-Up Business in this Subtitle means a business based in Prince				
27	George's County and in operation for 36 months or less.				
28	(b) [(a)]Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Grant Program.				
29	(1) The Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Grant Program is				
30	hereby established as a program in which the County shall annually award grants				
31	to Locally Owned and Operated Businesses for the purposes of the following				

1	1	activities occurring in Prince George's County:					
2		(A) Business expansion, business capacity-building, and business retention,					
3		(B) Job creation and job retention, and					
4		(C) Business start-ups and early-stage business growth.					
5	(2)	[At least 30% of the annual awards from the Prince George's County Business					
6	(=)	Expansion and Start-Up Grant Program shall be reserved for Local Start-Up					
7		Businesses.]					
8		Allocation of the annual awards.					
9		(A) Awards from the Prince George's County Business Expansion and					
10		Start-Up Grant Program shall be distributed annually as follows:					
11		i. 30% reserved for Local Start-Up Businesses; and					
12		ii. 20% for businesses that are located within the beltway as					
13		described in subsection (4)(A) below; and					
14		iii. 50% for all other applications subject to subsection (4).					
15		(B) Should a business qualify for an award under multiple categories					
16		among i-iii above, then the award allocated shall only be counted under					
17		one (1) category for purposes of calculating distribution percentages of					
18		annual award allocation.					
19	(3)	The maximum annual grant award from this program shall be \$250,000;					
20	(4)	Priority Industry Sectors. The County Council, by resolution, with the					
21		concurrence of the County Executive, may establish priority industry sectors for					
22		awards from this grant program, including the proportion of the annual awards					
23		that shall be reserved for such priority industry sectors. At a minimum, the					
24	priority sectors will include businesses:						
25		(A) located within the beltway (the area in the County between the border with					
26		the District of Columbia and the Capital Beltway); or					
27		(B) within one-quarter mile of a transit station; or					
28		(C) within one of the primary or secondary growth sectors outlined in the					
29		Approved Economic Development Strategic Action Plan for Prince George's

31	(5)	Any recipient of an award under this Subsection shall:					

1	(A) be a registered business in good standing with the State of Maryland and
2	County at the time of award; and
3	(B) Remain a County-based business for at least the next sixty (60) months of
4	the business's existence after receipt of the award, as a written condition of
5	acceptance of the award.
6	(6) Annual Report.
7	(A) The County Council and County Executive may request an annual report
8	
9	<u>to</u> <u>be provided with analysis on the Prince George's County Business</u>
10	Expansion and Start-Up Grant Program to include at a minimum the
11	following information categorized by
12	race and gender of each applicant:
13	i. The name of applicant; and
14	ii. Names of applicants awarded grants; and
15	iii. Names of those applicants denied grants; and
16	iv. Amount of fund awarded per grant.
17	(B) <u>If requested, then the report shall be submitted within 90 days.</u>
18	[Definitions.
19	(A) Locally-Owned and Operated Business, in this Subtitle, means a County-
20	based business that is also a County resident-owned business as defined in
21	Subtitle 10A of the Code.
22	(B) Local Start-Up Business in this Subtitle means a business based in Prince
23	George's County and in operation for 36 months or less.]
24	(c) [(b)]Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Loan Program.
25	(1) The Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Loan Program is
26	hereby established as a program in which the County shall annually award no-
27	interest loans to Locally-Owned and Operated Businesses for the purposes of the
28	following activities occurring in Prince George's County:
29	(A) Business expansion, business capacity-building, and business retention;
30	(B) Job creation and job retention; and
31	(C) Business start-ups and early-stage business growth.

(2) [At least 30% of the annual awards from the Prince George's County Business Expansion and Start-Up Loan Program shall be reserved for Local Start-Up Businesses.]

Allocation of the annual awards.

- (A) <u>Awards from the Prince George's County Business Expansion and</u>

 <u>Start-Up Loan Program shall be distributed annually as follows:</u>
 - i. 30% reserved for Local Start-Up Businesses; and
 - ii. 20% for business that are located within the beltway as described in subsection (6)(A) below; and
 - iii. 50% for all other applications subject to subsection (6).
- (B) Should a business qualify for an award under multiple categories among i-iii above, then the award allocated shall only be counted under one (1) category for purposes of calculating distribution percentages of annual award allocation.
- (3) The maximum annual loan award from this program shall be \$250,000.
- (4) Loan repayment shall include zero percent (0%) interest and a twelve (12) month deferment between the remittance of the loan funds to the business and the date of the first repayment.
- (5) Any recipient of a loan award under this Subsection shall:
 - (A) be a registered business in good standing with the State of Maryland and the County; and
 - (B) Remain a County-based business for at least the next sixty (60) months of the
 - business's existence after receipt of the loan, as a written condition of accepting the loan.
- (6) Priority Industry Sectors. The County Council, by resolution, with the concurrence of the County Executive, may establish priority industry sectors for awards from this Program, including the proportion of the annual awards that shall be reserved for such priority industry sectors. At a minimum, the priority sectors will include businesses:
 - (A) located within the beltway (the area in the County between the border with

1	the District of Columbia and the Capital Beltway); or					
2	(B) within one-quarter mile of a transit station; or					
3	(C) within one of the primary or secondary growth sectors outlined in the					
4	Approved Economic Development Strategic Action Plan for Prince George's					
5	County.					
6	(7) <u>Annual Report.</u>					
7	(A) The County Council and County Executive may request an annual report to					
8	be provided with analysis on the Prince George's County Business					
9	Expansion and Start-Up Loan Program to include at a minimum the

13	iii. Names of those applicants denied loans; and					
14	iv. Amount of funds awarded per loan.					
15	(B) <u>If requested, then the report shall be submitted within 90 days.</u>					
16	(d) [(c)] Prince George's County Technology Incentive Program					
17	(1) There is a Prince George's County Technology Incentive Program, which includes					
18	a Prince George's County Biosciences Supplemental Incentive Program and					
19	Prince George's County New Technologies Incentive Program.

21	(e) [(d)] Prince George's County Small Business Accelerator Program.					
22	(1) The Prince George's County Small Business Accelerator Program is hereby					
23	established as a program in which the County shall make grant awards to foster					
24	the expansion or establishment of small and minority business capacity

26	(f) [(e)] Prince George's County Small Business Capital and Growth Stimulus Fund is					
27	hereby established as a non-lapsing fund from which the County shall provide funding					
28	for the programs authorized under this section. The Fund shall be administered in					
29	accordance with Subsection (f), below.					
30	(g) [(f)] Fund Management of the Prince George's County Small Business Capital and					
31	Growth Stimulus Program.

SECTION 2. F	BE IT FURTHER	R ENAC	TED th	at the Co	ounty Exe	cutive and C	County Council
shall in writing reevaluate and reconsider the need of the Act to address disparities in							
opportunities for businesses that are located within the beltway, with the goal of servicing at least							
fifty-percent (50%) of African-American businesses, within the next five (5) years or at the time							
of the next County Disparity Study, whichever occurs earlier.							
SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that the provisions of this Act are hereby							
declared to be severable; and, in the event that any section, subsection, paragraph, subparagraph,							
sentence, clause, ph	rase, or word of	this Act	is decla	ared inva	lid or unc	onstitutiona	l by a court of
competent jurisdicti	ion, such invalidi	ty or unc	constitu	ıtionality	shall not	affect the re	emaining
words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subparagraphs, paragraphs, subsections, or sections of this							
Act, since the same would have been enacted without the incorporation in this Act of any such							
invalid or unconstitu	invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, subparagraph, subsection,
