Irving, a resident of District Heights; Ms. Oladunni M. Oni, a resident of Riverdale; Mr. Kelvin E. Smith, a resident of Brandywine; Ms. Gloria D. Snowden, a resident of Laurel; Ms. Rochelle C. Thompson, a resident of Landover; Ms. Betty Tingle, a resident of Mitchellville; and Ms. Tamara S.J. Williams, a resident of Mitchellville are new appointments to the Advisory Board.

The terms for Ms. Jocelyn H. Alexander, Ms. Oladunni M. Oni and Ms. Betty Tingle will expire on June 30, 2025.

The term for Ms. Rochelle C. Thompson will expire on June 20, 2026. The terms for Ms. Gloria D. Snowden, and Ms. Tamara S.J. Williams will expire on June 30, 2026.
