CR-37-2003 - A RESOLUTION CONCERNING SUPPORTING THE REAPPOINTMENT OF CHAPLAIN HENRY VINTON PLUMMER for the purpose of supporting the efforts of the Committee to Clear Chaplain Plummer to seek review and reappointment by the United States Army and Congress of Chaplain Henry Vinton Plummer, a Prince George's County native and the first African-American Chaplain to be commissioned in the United States Army (post-Reconstruction), who was court-martialed and dishonorably discharged in 1894. - ADOPTED
