Pursuant to Chapter 594 of the 2005 Laws of Maryland, the Public Safety and Behavioral Health surcharge is required to be adjusted each fiscal year for inflation pursuant to the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). The CPI-U for April 2024 increased by 3.4% and results in a surcharge increase of \$106 above the Fiscal Year 2024 surcharge of \$3,123 for permits issued inside the Developed Tier and inside an area included in a certain basic plan or conceptual site plan. The projected increase in the CPI-U results in a surcharge increase of \$318 above the Fiscal Year 2024 public safety surcharge of \$9,362 for permits issued for all other buildings.

For Fiscal Year 2025, the Public Safety and Behavioral Health surcharge shall be \$3,229 for permits issued for construction located inside the Transportation Service Area 1, as defined by the Maryland - National Capital Park and Planning Commission in the Prince George's County Approved General Plan, and for construction in an area included in a basic plan or conceptual site plan that abuts an existing or planned mass transit rail station site operated by the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority or Maryland Transit Administration and complies with the requirements of any sector plan, master plan or overlay zone approved by the Prince George's County District Council. The Public Safety and Behavioral Health for Fiscal Year 2025 shall be \$9,680 for all other buildings.

	Pursuant to Section 10-192(b)(1)(B) of the Prince George's County Code, for Fiscal Year 2005 and each succeeding fiscal year, the school facilities surcharge shall be adjusted for inflation in accordance with the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for the preceding fiscal year for which the amount is being calculated. The school facilities surcharge applies to all buildings unless it is exempted from this requirement under Section 10-192.01 or qualifies for a reduction in the school facilities surcharge.		

The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for April 2024, compared to April 2023, shows an increase of 3.4%. The increase results in

a surcharge of \$390 above the Fiscal Year 2024 school facilities surcharge of \$11,560 for permits issued for buildings between Interstate Highway 495 and the District of Columbia and for permits issued for buildings included within a basic plan or conceptual site plan that abuts an existing or planned mass transit rail station site operated by the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority. For permits for all other buildings, the increase in the CPI-U results in a surcharge increase of \$674 above the Fiscal Year 2024 school facilities surcharge of \$19,826.

For Fiscal Year 2025 the school facilities surcharge shall be \$11,950 for permits issued for buildings located between Interstate Highway 495 and the District of Columbia; or included within a basic plan or conceptual site plan that abuts an existing or planned mass transit rail station site operated by the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority or the Maryland Transit Administration. For all other buildings, the surcharge for permits issued shall be \$20,500.

Rana Hightower, Director, Planning, Housing and Economic Development Committee (PHED), provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations of the PHED Committee for CB-015-2024.

On April 1, 2022, the County's new Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Regulations, and Landscape Manual took effect. These codes were initially adopted on October 23, 2018, with the approval of CB-13-2018, *CB-14-2018, and CB-15-2018. The Zoning Ordinance was subsequently* amended with omnibus technical corrections bills via CB-98-2021 and CB-68-2022. A prior version of this first omnibus substantive corrections bill was transmitted to the Council during the 2023 Legislative Year (CB-073-2023), but review was not completed in time for enactment during the 2023 legislative year. This bill incorporates the changes put forth in CB-073-2023, along with additional necessary updates and revisions to the new County Zoning Ordinance, drawing on staff, decision-maker, and stakeholder comments and observations since April 1, 2022. As with the 2023 iteration of the omnibus zoning corrective bill, this legislation is intended to implement clarifying language, corrections, and targeted additions and deletions to ensure the new Zoning Ordinance is functioning as intended when it was adopted and took effect.
