Staff provided a summary of the resolution and referral comments that were received. CR-84-2009 adopts the County's Debris Management Plan in order to be eligible for Federal Assistance after a debris generating disaster in Prince Georges County. Staff from the Office of Emergency Management (OEM) and Department of Environmental Resources (DER) provided additional information to the Committee, including that Federal Assistance would not be available until after a Federal declaration of a event.

The Chair and Committee members requested a full briefing on the Debris Management Plan during the 2010 Legislative Session.

The Office of Law determined that CR-84-2009 was in proper legislative form.
