## RESOLUTION

## A RESOLUTION concerning

Notification to Neighborhoods of School Site Selections

For the purpose of recommending to the Board of Education that property owners and civic associations in affected neighborhoods be advised of proposed school site locations, before final site selections are made.

WHEREAS, Prince George's County will have substantial new school construction in the next five- to ten-year period, to alleviate overcrowding in the County school system; and

WHEREAS, a significant part of the school construction process involves the selection of sites for new schools: and

WHEREAS, new school sites will be located near the residential neighborhoods where they are needed, and it is usually necessary to locate new schools in or adjacent to occupied residential properties; and

WHEREAS, the construction of a new school within an established residential neighborhood may have substantial adverse affects on the neighborhood, particularly those properties adjacent to or near the new school; and

WHEREAS, to date, the County and the Board of Education have not made efforts to involve residential neighborhoods in the school site selection process, even though such involvement would improve the process and would allow residential neighborhoods to better absorb the impacts of new schools; and

WHEREAS, the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, believes that the Board of Education and County government would benefit from procedures which give notice to and allow participation by neighborhood residents and civic associations, prior to the selection of new school sites in residential neighborhoods.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that the Council recommends to the Board of Education that the following procedures be followed, prior to final selection of a school site in a particular neighborhood:

- A. When a school site or sites are to be selected, the Board of Education should determine the identities of property owners and residents within 500 feet of the proposed location or locations.
- B. At least 60 days before the Board makes a final school site selection in a particular neighborhood, all identified property owners and all civic associations in the neighborhood should receive written notice by mail that the Board of Education may take action to select an identified site for a new school.
- C. The notice to neighborhood residents and civic associations should state the location of the proposed school site and the time, date, and location of the Board hearing or other proceeding when public comment on the site selection will be received.
