**BILL**

AN ACT concerning

Door-to-Door Solicitation

FOR the purpose of restricting door-to-door soliciting to  
daytime hours.

BY repealing and reenacting with amendments:

SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES.

Section 5-207.5,  
The Prince George's County Code  
(1991 Edition).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 5-207.5 of the Prince George's County Code be and the same is hereby repealed and reenacted with the following amendments:

**SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES.**

**DIVISION 15. DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITORS.**

**Sec. 5-207.5. Prohibited acts.**

No licensee shall:

(a) Remain in a private residence or commercial establishment or on the premises thereof after the owner or occupant has requested the licensee to leave; or,

(b) Enter into or upon the premises of a private residence or commercial establishment for soliciting, when the owner or occupant thereof has displayed a "No Soliciting" sign on such premises[.]; or,

(c) Enter upon residential premises for soliciting during nighttime. Nighttime is defined in Section 1-102(a)(18) of this Code.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect forty-five (45) calendar days after it becomes law.
