PUBLIC SAFETY AND FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 9/19/96

Committee Vote: Favorable, as amended, 4-0 (In favor: Council Members Estepp, Bailey, Maloney and Scott).

This legislation will remove the specific reference to the day after Thanksgiving as a designated holiday. It will retain the County Appreciation Day, (which traditionally has been observed on the day after Thanksgiving), as a paid day off.

CB-86-1996 (DR-3) Summary

The loss of General Election Day, (CB-4-1996), as a paid holiday every two years, is compensated by giving employees an additional four (4) hours of personal leave annually. According to the Personnel Officer, part-time employees will receive 2 hours of personal leave annually. This compensation will prevent employees from suffering any diminution in their amount of paid leave.

The legislation was amended by adding a codified section on pp 2 line 13.

There should not be any negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of enacting CB-86-1996.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT (Includes reason for proposal, as well as any unique statutory requirements)

CB-4-1996 eliminated General Election Day (every other year) and substituted the Friday after Thanksgiving (every year) as a permanently designated holiday. Unless corrective action is taken this will give employees an additional holiday every other year.
