AN ACT concerning

Tempor _____ y Roadside Vendors

FOR the purpose of prohibiting sales, solicitations and distributions without the issuance of a valid use and occupancy permit and providing for penalties for violation.

BY adding:

SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES.

Sections 5-193.5.1

The Prince George's County Code

(1987 Edition, 1989 Supplement).

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED by the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland, that Section 5-193.5.1. is added to the Prince George's County Code:

SUBTITLE 5. BUSINESSES AND LICENSES.

DIVISION 12. PEDDLERS AND ITINERANT VENDORS.

Sec. 5-193.5.1. Prohibited sales, solicitations and distributions without a use and occupancy permit.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, by its officers, agents or employees, to sell or to attempt to sell goods, wares or merchandise of any description, or to solicit or accept any donation without first having obtained a valid use and occupancy permit in accordance with Sections 27-253, 27-259, 27-260 and 27-261, except for the following:

(1) goods or services sold or offered as a part of a fund raising activity by a not for profit group or organization.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to permit, authorize or direct any person, firm or corporation, by its officers, agents or employees to sell or to attempt to sell goods, wares or merchandise of any description, or to solicit or accept any donation in violation of this Section.

(c) Any person who violates the provisions of Subsections (a) or (b) of this Section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and, upon conviction, shall be subject to a fine of not less than One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). Each separate day the violation remains uncorrected is a separate and distinct violation subject to an additional citation and fine.

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED that this Act shall take effect on the thirtieth day of June, 1991.
