REPORT Committee Vote: Favorable with amendments, 4-0 (In favor: Council Members Harrison, Lehman, Toles and Turner)

CB-81-2014 seeks to amend the County Code provisions for licensing of massage establishments, operators, managers and technicians to require certain information be provided for the license. CB-81-2014 was recommended by the Prince George's County Human Trafficking Task Force 2013-14 Annual Report for addressing human trafficking issues in the County. The Committee staff oriented the Committee to a Proposed Draft 2 of CB-81-2014, along with all legislative comments. The amendment in Proposed Draft 2 would increase the annual license fee for managing a massage establishment from \$100 to \$250.
