

Chairman in a letter dated July 13, 1992. The study indicated that two privately owned wells remained in the area and that both property owners had been issued health hazard letters by the Health Department, which will expedite their application for public water service. WSSC has indicated that one property owner is in the process of hooking up to the system, and attempts are being made to contact the remaining property owner. As a result of this information, Chapter Seven, Section III, C of the proposed plan was amended to include references to the study, the impending hookup of the property owners, and the discontinuance of the Health Department testing.

Another amendment was offered by the Department of Environmental Resources to add to Chapter Six of the proposed plan a new Section V titled "Rubble and Construction/Demolition Material Recycling" and renumbering the existing Section V to VI. This amendment is in response to public hearing testimony that the plan did not address the recycling of these materials. This amendment will also bring the County's definition of rubble into conformance with the State definition.
