<u>CB-4-2004 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING PRISONS, DETENTION CENTERS</u>
<u>AND CORRECTION FACILITIES</u> for the purpose of amending the definitions in the Zoning Ordinance to add prisons and corrections facilities as a separate use and to prohibit the use in all zones. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 4 was presented by Council Member Dean and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee.

<u>CB-5-2004 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING WHOLESALING, DISTRIBUTION, AND RELATED STORAGE</u> for the purpose of permitting wholesaling, distribution, and related storage in the C-S-C Zone under certain circumstances. - <u>PRESENTED</u>

Council Bill 5 was presented by Council Member Hendershot and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee.

### **Introduction of Resolutions**

Council Resolution 6, supports a request by the Patuxent River Commission for federal legislation that will enable a study to determine the qualification of the Patuxent River for designation as a Federal Wild and Scenic River. Council Resolution 6 was introduced by Council Members Peters, Knotts, Hendershot, Shapiro, Harrington, Dernoga, Dean and Exum and referred to the Transportation, Housing and the Environment Committee.

<u>CR-7-2004 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING MARYLAND-NATIONAL CAPITAL</u>
<u>PARK AND PLANNING COMMISSION</u> for the purpose of transferring certain appropriations and expenditures between development projects in the Approved Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission's FY 2003-2004 Capital Budget and Fiscal Years 2004-2009 Capital Improvement Program. - <u>INTRODUCED</u>

Council Resolution 7 allows for the transfer of funds from the South Regional Technical/Recreation Complex Project and District 9 Development Reserve, in the amount of \$1,550,000, to five existing development projects. The projects are: Capitol Heights Area Park Improvements (\$400,000), Peppermill Community Center Athletic Field Lights (\$100,000), Bowie Civic Auditorium (\$720,000), District 4 Development Reserve (\$195,000), and Kentland Community Center Park (Golf Learning Center) (\$135,000). Council Resolution 7 was introduced by Council Members Dean, Dernoga, Exum, Harrington, Knotts and Peters and referred to the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee.
