Fiscal Year 2018 Budget Review

Budget Overview

The FY 2018 Proposed Budget for the Office of Law is \$3,933,900, an increase of \$105,000, or 2.7%, over the FY 2017 Approved Budget. This increase is largely due to funding a vacant Administrative Aid III position, anticipated merit increases and cost-of living adjustments, offset by an increase in recoveries anticipated in FY 2018. The Office of Law expenditures are funded entirely by the General Fund.

Staffing Changes and Compensation

- The staffing level in the FY 2018 Proposed Budget is 55 full-time positions, which is the same level of staffing as the FY 2017 approved level.
- The proposed FY 2018 compensation is increasing by \$154,300, or 3.2%, over the FY 2017 Approved Budget due to anticipated merit increases and cost-of-living adjustments (\$94,300), as well as funding a vacant position that was not funded in FY 2017 (\$60,000).
- As of March 2017, the Office reported four (4) vacant full-time positions. The FY 2018 Proposed Budget includes funding for three (3) of these positions. An Investigator position will remain unfunded in the upcoming fiscal year.
- In FY 2017, the Office has one position, an Executive Administrative Aide, assigned to the Office of the County Executive. This assignment will continue in FY 2018.

Fringe Benefits

- Fringe benefit expenditures are proposed to increase by \$105,300, or 7.4%, above the FY 2017 Approved Budget due to the anticipated increase in compensation.
- A five-year trend analysis of fringe benefit expenditures is included below.

Operating Expenses

FY 2018 operating expenses are proposed at \$448,800 and are comprised of the following major items:

Overall, operating expenses are increasing by \$7,400, or 1.7%, over the FY 2017 Approved Budget. The accompanying table compares the FY 2018 Proposed Budget operating expenditures with the FY 2017 Approved Budget operating expenditures. FY 2018 Proposed Budget expenditures increase in four (4) categories compared to the FY 2017 Approved Budget. In two (2) of the categories, the FY 2018 Proposed Budget reduces planned spending from the FY 2017 Approved Budget. In six (6) of the categories, the FY 2018 proposed budget level remains unchanged.

- The most significant increase between the FY 2018 Proposed Budget and the FY 2017 Approved Budget is in Printing (\$5,500 increase) to align with actual expenditures.
- The most significant dollar reduction between the FY 2018 Proposed Budget and the FY 2017 Approved Budget is in Miscellaneous expenditures (\$1,500 reduction) associated with a decrease in court filing fees.

Recoveries

FY 2018 proposed recoveries are \$2,994,800, an increase of \$162,000, or 5.7%, over the FY 2017 approved budget level. The following recoveries are for legal services provided by the Office to various agencies:

Highlights

- During FY 2017, the Office of Law negotiated multiple public and private partnership agreements related to healthcare being provided to the poor and Howard University nursing students acquiring clinical training.
- The Office of Law successfully defended CB-46-2010 and CB-56-2011 before the U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland in law suits challenging the constitutionality of these statues. The case has currently reached the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit.
- In serving the County's legal needs, the Office of Law manages and utilizes several legal services contracts in various areas of specialty. The Office reports that in FY 2017, approximately 24 legal services contracts are in place totaling \$922,976. These contracts support a variety of County agencies and are budgeted within the respective agencies where services are provided. Several vendors have multiple contracts with the County. Please see Attachment 1.
- Several legislative bills were being considered in the Maryland General Assembly 2017 Session that would have an impact on the Board's operations and finances. Please see Response #21, Page 9 of the FY 2018 Budget Review, First Round Questions.
- The following bill, which passed the Maryland General Assembly 2017 Session, was identified as having a potential operational or fiscal impact on the Office of Law's programs and operations:
 - O HB 642 creates a cause of action for damages against sexual perpetrators, but also allows the victim to file suit against a governmental entity if the government entity was aware of the abuse and failed to protect the victim. This bill, which was signed by the Governor on April 4, 2017, may create additional liability for the Department of Social Services.
