CB-106-2004 – AN ACT CONCERNING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF **SPECIAL OBLIGATION BONDS** for the purpose of providing that one or more series of special obligation bonds may be issued from time to time under the provisions of this Act, Article 41, Sections 14-201 through 14-214 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended (2003 Replacement Volume) (the "Tax Increment Act''), and Resolution No. 63-2004 of the County Council of Prince George's County, Maryland (the "Formation Resolution") in an amount not to exceed the aggregate principal amount of Fourteen Million Dollars (\$14,000,000) in order for the County to finance the construction of the parking improvements and infrastructure improvements as more particularly described herein; making certain findings and determinations, among others, concerning the public benefit and purpose of such special obligation bonds; providing that such special obligation bonds authorized to be issued hereby shall be payable, from the amounts levied and deposited in the Tax Increment Fund (as defined in the Formation Resolution) and any other tax revenues deposited therein and that the special obligation bonds shall not constitute a general obligation debt of the County or a pledge of the County's full faith and credit or taxing power other than the taxes representing the levy on the Tax Increment (as defined in the Formation Resolution); authorizing the County Executive of the County to specify, prescribe, determine, provide for and approve certain details, forms, documents or procedures in connection with such special obligation bonds issued hereunder and any other matters necessary or desirable in connection with the authorization, issuance, sale and payment of such special obligation bonds; authorizing the County Executive to take certain actions, to execute documents and make certain commitments on behalf of the County in connection with the issuance, sale and delivery of such special obligation bonds; authorizing the execution and delivery of such special obligation bonds and such other documents as may be necessary and desirable to effectuate the financing of the infrastructure improvements and the issuance, sale and delivery of such special obligation bonds; and generally providing for, and determining various matters in connection with, the issuance, sale, delivery and payment of such special obligation bonds.

CR-63-2004 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING NORTHGATE COLLEGE PARK

DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT for the purpose of designating a contiguous area within

Prince George's County, Maryland (the "County") as a "development district" as that term is used in Sections 14-201 through 14-214, inclusive of Article 41 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, as amended (2003 Replacement Volume) (the "Tax Increment Act") and as such development district to be located in the City of College Park, an incorporated area of the County and to be known as the "Northgate College Park Development District" providing for, and determining, various matters in connection with the establishment of a development district creating a tax increment fund with respect to the development district allocating certain property taxes with respect to the development district to be paid over to the tax increment fund as provided in the Tax Increment Act; making certain findings and determinations with respect to the tax increment fund and the use of such fund; providing that special obligation bonds may be issued from time to time pursuant to an ordinance or ordinances enacted in accordance with the Tax Increment Act, and secured by the tax increment fund and generally relating to the Northgate College Park Development District.
