Committee Vote: Favorable, 3-0, (In favor: Councilmembers Wilson, Dernoga and Hendershot).

This resolution will express the Council's support for the construction of a suitable memorial to the victims of the 9/11 attack on the United States and to the subsequent victims of the war on terrorism.

Shortly after the attack on the Pentagon a group of citizens held a candlelight vigil and installed a cross in Glassmanor on the District of Columbia boundary line. As a result, a proposal was made for a permanent marker to be placed at a veterans' cemetery in Forest Heights, Maryland. At the present time, the group is looking at the Addison Cemetery where John Hanson, the President of the Continental Congress, is buried and where there is a need to preserve the cemetery area.

A copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the members of the Maryland Congressional Delegation, members of the Prince George's County delegation to the Maryland General Assembly and the Mayor and Council of the Town of Forest Heights.

There is no negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of adopting CR-3-2002.
