PUBLIC SAFETY & FISCAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT Date: 7/25/02

Committee Vote: Favorable with recommended amendments, 3-0, (In favor: Councilmembers Wilson, Dernoga and Hendershot).

This legislation will amend the County's Classification Plan by abolishing certain classes of work that are obsolete in keeping with the maintenance of the County's Classification Plan. Also, as a result of a review conducted by the Office of Personnel and Labor Relations, certain classes of work have been re-titled.

The legislation was amended as follows:

1. On page 1:
After "work" strike "and" insert a comma;
And in line 4 after, "work" insert "and changing the grade of an existing class of work."
2. On page 2:
After line 29, insert:

[1005G Deputy Administrator to County Council, G-35]
(\$70,864 - \$112,660)

1005G Deputy Administrator to County Council, G-39
(\$86,136 - \$136,939)

There should not be any negative fiscal impact on the County as a result of enacting CB-74-2002.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION/FISCAL IMPACT

The purpose of this legislation is to abolish certain classes of work that are obsolete in keeping with the maintenance of the classification plan. Additionally, certain classes of work have been re-titled as a result of a review conducted by the Office of Personnel and Labor Relations.
