<u>CB-69-2004 (DR-2) – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING C-O ZONE</u> for the purpose of modifying acreage requirements for multifamily dwellings in the C-O Zone. <u>- -INTRODUCED</u>

Council Member Dernoga, as Chair of the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee, provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations of the Committee.

Council Bill 69 modifies the acreage requirement for multifamily dwellings in the C-O Zone.

Council Bill 69 was favorably reported out of the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development

Committee on September 29, 2004 with amendments. Council Bill 69, Draft 2 was introduced by

Council Member Hendershot, and favorably reported out of PZED on 09/29/2004 with

amendments.

<u>CB-78-2004 – AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING RECYCLING PLANTS AND</u>

CONCRETE RECYCLING FACILITIES for the purpose of defining concrete recycling facility, amending the definition of recycling plant to exclude concrete recycling facilities, and to require a special exception for concrete recycling facilities under certain circumstances.

AMENDED; DR-2 INTRODUCED

Council Member Dernoga, as Chairman of the Planning, Zoning and Economic Development Committee, provided a verbal report of the actions and recommendations of the Ceommittee. Council Bill 78 defines concrete recycling facility, amending the definition of recycling plant to exclude concrete recycling facilities, to require a special exception for concrete recycling facilities, and prohibitsing the use of a rock crusher in conjunction with the manufacturing or cutting of structural products made of clay, concrete, glass, stone, or similar materials under certain conditions. Council Bill 78 was favorably reported out of the Planning Zoning and Economic Development Committee on September 29, 2004. Council Member Dernoga moved amendment number 1 to Council Bill 784; seconded by Council Member Harrington. The mMotion carried by voice vote (Council District 2-vacant). Council Bill 78, Draft 2 was introduced by Council Members Dernoga and Harrington. Council Bill 78 was favorably reported out of PZED on 09/29/2004.

<u>CR-65-2004 – A RESOLUTION CONCERNING A SECTOR PLAN (MASTER PLAN AMENDMENT) AND CONCURRENT SECTIONAL MAP AMENDMENT (SMA) FOR</u>

THE EAST GLENN DALE AREA for the purpose of initiating an amendment to the 1993 Approved Master Plan and Sectional Map Amendment for Glenn Dale-Seabrook-Lanham and Vicinity (Planning Area 70) and the 2002 Approved Prince George's County General Plan that will re-evaluate land use intensity and compatibility. The goals of the sector plan are to enhance the quality economic development, preserve and protect environmentally sensitive and scenic land, and make efficient us of existing and proposed county infrastructure and investment for the East Glenn Dale Area (see Sector Plan boundary map).
