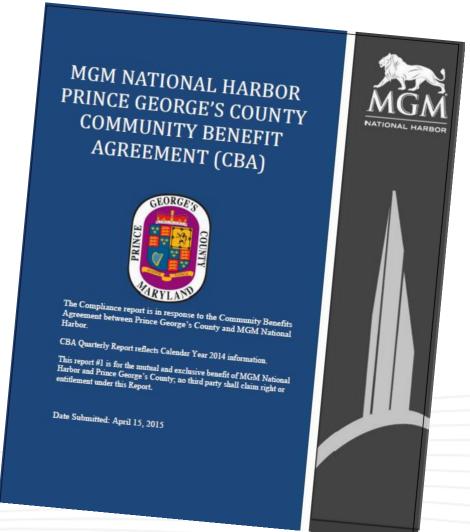


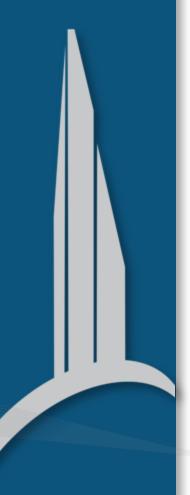
MGM National Harbor is well on its way to fulfilling its commitment toward local and minority business participation.

- Exceeded CBA goals for local and minority business participation in two categories



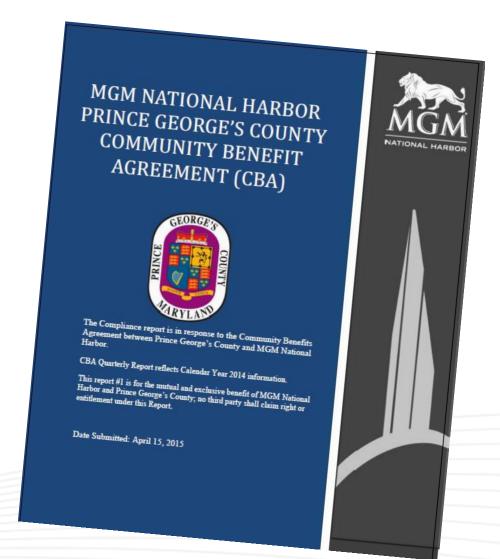


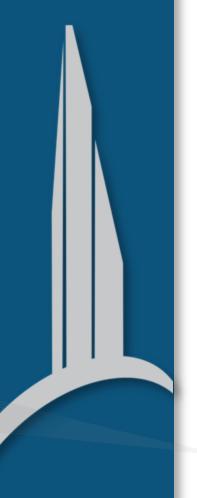


First Quarterly Report filed April 15, 2015

For work performed during 2014





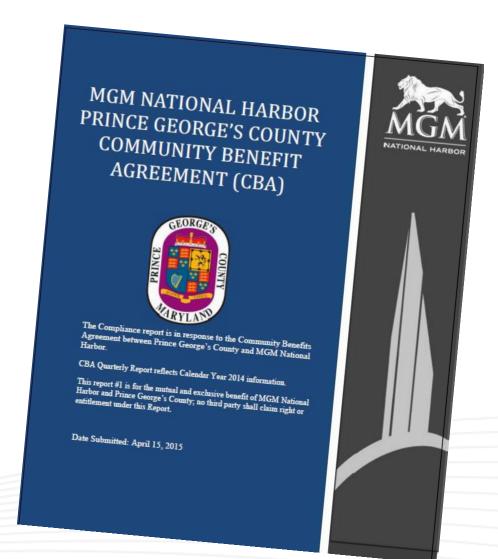

All work performed during 2014





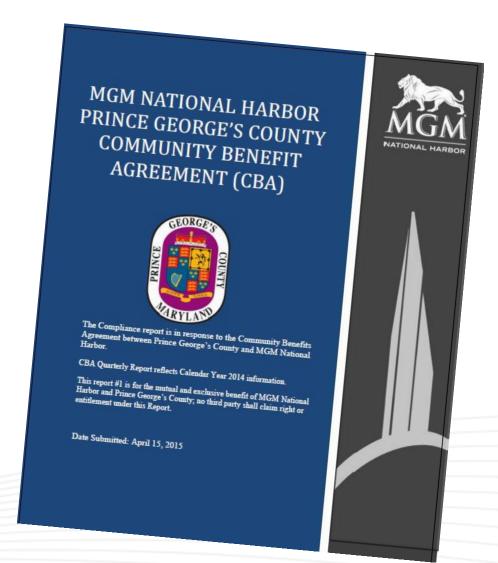

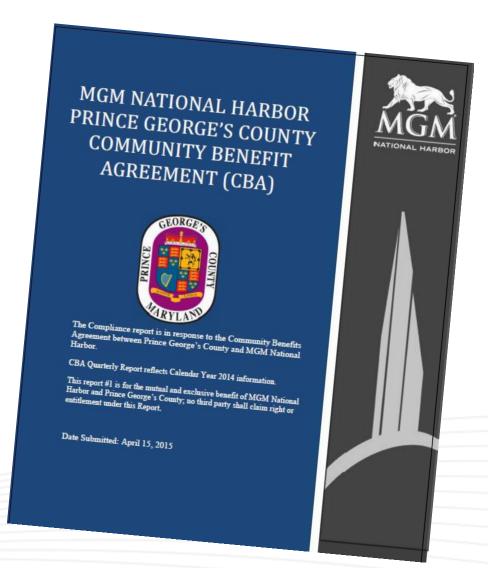

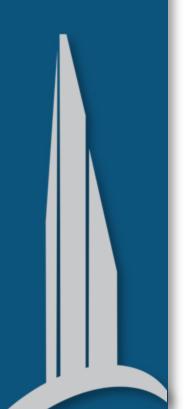


Meeting Our Goals

SETTING UP FOR SUCCESS

- Offering MBE vendors assistance with prequalification and bidding
- Breaking out bid packages geared toward Prince George's County trades and minority vendors
- Breaking out design and construction for restaurant and retail venues into individual projects suitable for bid by local and minority General Contractors
- Signed statements of intent with MBEs are mandatory and MBE allocation percentages are a highly weighted factor in the value-based award decision
- Monitoring and evaluating prime contractors' required efforts for MBE participation throughout project





Meeting Our Goals

CERTIFICATION

- All MDOT certified contractors will be encouraged to pursue County certification, if not already held
- Encouraging all contractors to register with County as CBEs
- Proactively track expiration dates of all certified MBEs and providing 30/60/90 day renewal notifications





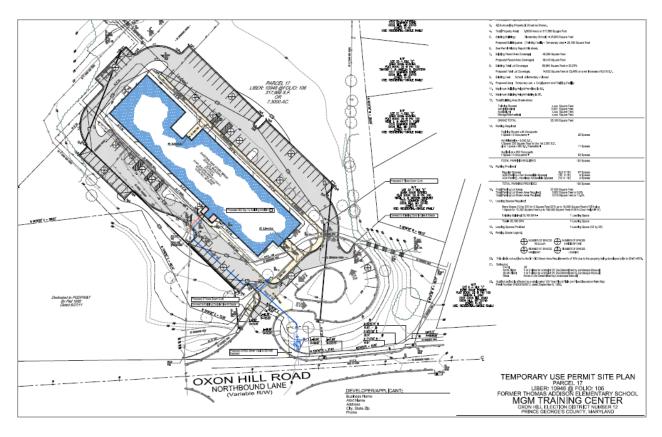
Meeting Our Goals

CORPORATE MENTORSHIP

- For bidders evaluated as not qualified, review areas needing improvement and introduce potential qualified partners.
- Follow-up meetings with minority prime package bidders to ensure bid process issues or interpretation of scope did not prevent bid from being competitive
- General Contractor required to meet with unsuccessful bidders at Community Resource Center to discuss how bid could be improved
- Identify and discuss resources for bonding and financial support

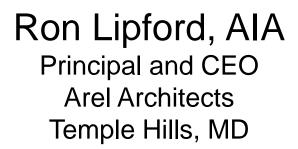


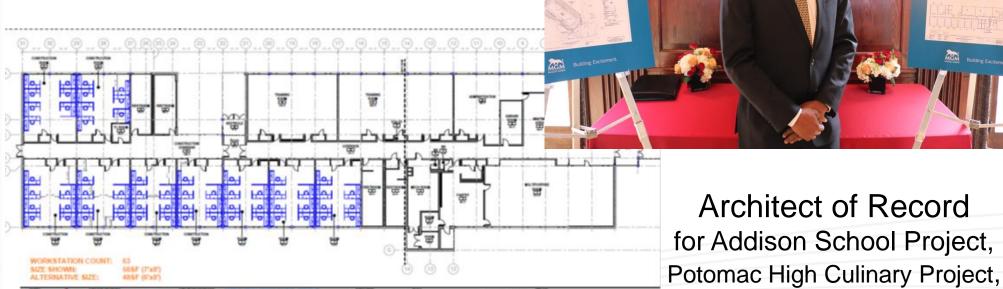

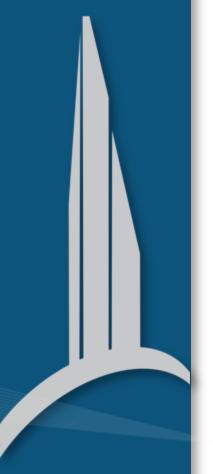

Local Investment Program

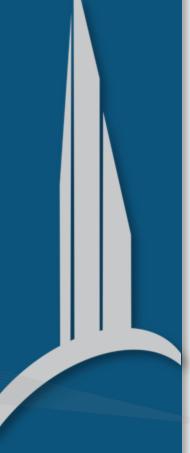
